### Talks With Far Away Places Possible When Phones Put In

What! You had to wait three hours for a long distance telephone in the YMCA? The Student Senate recognized this inconvenience last October and appointed a committee consisting of Neal Galloway, chairman; Charlie Kirkham, and Luther Terry.

The committee contacted the Southwestern States Telephone Company and mapped plans to install more long distance telephones on the Campus.

Working with Dean of Men W. L. Penberthy and Bennie Zinn, assistant dean of men, the committee selected the following places for telephones to be installed for use twenty-four hours a day:

Four phones in Dorm 12, one in Hart Hall, one in Goodwin, and one in Walton.

The plan has come out of the Valley of the Shadow of Red Tape and the four phones are already installed in Dorm 12 and are in use. Southwestern Telephone has assured the committee that the rest of the phones will be mailed into Hart, Goodwin, and Walton as soon as the requisite material squeezes through the bottlenecks.

The senate committee ran a quick survey of where the available long distance phones are situated around the campus and came up with these results:

Four phones in the YMCA, two in the Aggeland Inn, two in College View, two in Lipscomb's Drug one in Campus Corner, one in Duncan, one in Anchor Hall, one in American Legion Hall, one in the Project House area, one at the Blue Top Courts, one in the Aggeland Pharmacy, and one in the Bus Station.

There is communication with the outside now, but there will be more presently.

The animal husbandry department has purchased a Delaine Merino ram that won top honors at the San Angelo Fat Stock Show and at the Gillespie County Fair in Fredericksburg.

The ram was purchased from Owen Bragg, Delaine breeder, of Talpa, Texas for \$200. In making the announcement of the purchase J. A. Gray, professor of animal husbandry, stated that the newly acquired ram would be used for breeding purposes with the college flock.

The college owns about 30 Delaine Merino ewes and it is expected that some desirable breeding will result from the use of the newly purchased ram.
