This year for the first time in the memory of most Aggies A&M teams are in a position to win championships in a

majority of the spring sports, and if the snowings of the Ag Freshman teams is an indication of things to come, the Farmers will be much stronger in all sports next

Out of five conference champion-ships awarded in spring sports Aggie teams stand a good chance to cop three.

The Aggie gelf team has only to win two out of six matches with Arkansas this weekend to cinch the conference championship, and the Farmer track team is rated an even choice to win the track championship despite the great show of strength that Texas U. has made at relay meets the last few weekends.

The last time that the Aggies won a golf championship was in 1927 when Gayther Nowell, present Aggie coach, was playing. Since then Texas has completely dominated the sport with not a single interruption in a long string of championships. 
