

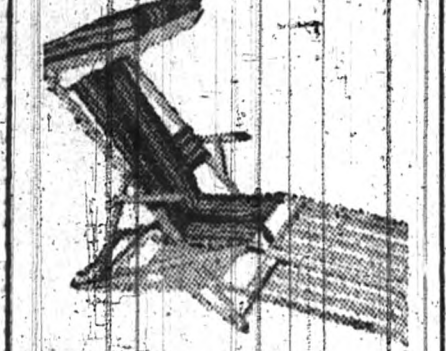

2 Scientists to Visit Campus On 'Stillingia' Tree Project

John C. Moore, director, and Francis Scofield, both of the Scientific Section of the National Paint, Varnish, and Lacquer Association, Washington, D. C., will visit the campus Monday, Dr. William M. Potts of the chemistry department said yesterday.

Purpose of their visit will be to plan a cooperative project for the development of the Stillingia tree or Sapium sebiferum as a commercial crop.

Dr. Potts spent a week in New York during January in the research laboratories of a paint manufacturing company that is interested in the development of the Stillingia tree. Plans were formulated at that time for a cooperative project and Moore's visit is the result of the conference held at that time.

The tree, a native of China, is a source of drying oil; tallow, protein, and other products, Dr. Potts said. The drying oil, easier to extract and clearer than linseed oil, is a superior oil for paints. The tallow makes a good vegetable shortening. The protein from the seed is a high grade protein, too valuable for livestock feed.

A specimen of the Stillingia tree can be seen in the yard of J. S. Muford of the Agronomy department.

The tree, which grows as much as six feet during the first year, produces seed the second or third year. Some of these trees are known to be over one hundred years old and still producing seed. As yet the cost of harvesting the seed has not been figured. Moore is a 1922 graduate of A&M in chemical engineering. While on the campus he will discuss the chemistry and engineering problems involved in the manufacture of paints.

Conferences can be arranged with Moore or Scofield for May 10, preferably in the afternoon. Appointments can be made through Dr. Potts in the Chemistry Office.

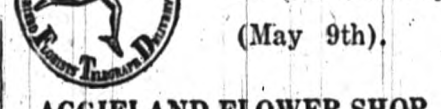

VOTERS OF A&M CONSOLIDATED

At a meeting on April 12 the Board of Trustees of the A&M Consolidated Independent School District received 25 petitions signed by 307 voters of the District, requesting the School Board to call an election in the District for the purpose of taking action on the following propositions:

FIRST: To bring the school tax rate limit up to the legally authorized figure of \$1.50, as so many other Texas schools have already done.

SECOND: To authorize the School Board to issue bonds up to a total of \$125,000 to finance construction and repair of additional classrooms to meet the expanding needs of a growing community.

The School Board has ordered the election, and the date is set for SATURDAY, MAY 1. Every qualified voter of the District should go to the polls and vote, as no issue is more vital to this community than the one to be decided by this election. College Station is the home of a great institution of higher learning, and it now becomes a question of whether our public schools in the District shall suffer by comparison.
