4-Point Program Outlined at A&M Accounting Meet

A four-fold basis necessary to the success of a business was outlined Tuesday by R. G. Dunlop, president of the Sun Oil Company, Philadelphia, at the opening session of the A&M Accounting Conference.

"No business can successfully survive unless its management accepts and discharges the responsibilities attached to its activities on this four-fold basis," he said.

"With the progressive separation between the functions of management and ownership necessarily accompanying large corporate organizations, management assumes a four-fold responsibility. These responsibilities are: to the public and government; to the consumer of the company's products or services; to the employees of the company; and to the stockholders or owners of the company.

"The accountant historically writes management's record and provides it with the accounting of its stewardship in respect to these responsibilities," the oil company president said.

More than 200 are attending the conference which ends this evening.
