**Weedon Announces For Tax Assessor Of Brazos County**  
 L. M. "Mig" Weedon has announced that he will again be a candidate for the office of tax assessor-collector of Brazos County, subject to action of the Democratic primary. Weedon was appointed to that office in 1942, and was elected to that position later that year. In announcing his candidacy, Weedon said: "In 1942 the tax valuation of Brazos County was \$11,059,325.59, and in 1947 it increased to \$13,826,493.12, an increase of 25 percent. "In 1942 automobile registration amounted to \$74,441.44, and in 1947 automobile registration increased to \$117,632.67. "Tax receipts issued in 1942 were 6,396, and in 1947 were 8,226. "Total taxes of all kinds collected in 1947 were \$386,001.97."
