Subject: Commencement Accommodations for Ladies  
To: All Students

1. In compliance with the request of the Committee in charge, and with the approval of the Office of the Dean of Men, ramps 1 and 2 of Walton Hall and Post Graduate Hall will be used to provide accommodations for visiting ladies attending the Final Ball and Commencement activities Thursday and Friday, June 3 and 4, 1948.

2. Students having guests staying in Walton will be assessed a charge of \$1.25 per night per guest to cover cost of mattresses and other incidental expenses. Those having guests staying in Post Graduate Hall will be assessed a charge of \$1.00 per night. (Sheets, pillow cases, blankets, pillows and mattresses will be provided.) Refreshments cannot be made.

3. Guests will be admitted to their rooms at 4:00 p. m. Thursday, June 3 and Friday, June 4. Linenage will be removed from rooms and the dormitories locked promptly at that time. The College cannot be responsible for the personal property of any guest or any student.

4. Room assignments may be made at room 100 Goodwin Hall beginning at 8:00 a. m. Wednesday, May 26.

5. In compliance with College regulations, guests staying in the dormitories must be in not later than 1:00 a. m. each night. Guests must check in with the matron upon their return to the dormitory after the dance. When reservations have been made for the guests, they will not be permitted to check out until departure for their homes. This will be done with the matron. Escorts will be held strictly accountable for compliance with these instructions.

session and shall be submitted to general student vote not more than fifteen days after presentation.

2. Measures may be initiated by any student. Such measures shall be presented to the Executive Committee to be considered for the agenda.

Section IX. Meetings.

1. Regular monthly meetings shall be held on the days designated by the majority of the members of the Student Senate at the beginning of each semester.

2. Special meetings may be called by the majority of the Executive Committee.

3. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the Student Senate.

4. All regular meetings of the Student Senate shall be open to visitors.

Section X. By-laws. The Student Senate shall have the power to make its own by-laws, by the expression of the will of a majority.

Section XI. Summer Session. The Student Senate will continue to function throughout the summer. All Senators attending the summer sessions shall comprise a summer government organized as they shall deem expedient to carry on the business during the summer sessions only if president doesn't plan to attend summer ses-
