LONDON, June 13 —(AP)—America's strongly balanced Wightman Cup tennis team swept the final four matches on the program at Wimbledon to complete a six-one conquest of Britain's game but out-gunned lassies.

The only excitement of the second day's play was supplied by Mrs. Jean Nicoll Bostock of the British side when she carried Louise Brough of Berkeley Hills, Calif., the reigning American champion, through three furious-fought sets only to lose, 6-2, 4-6, 7-5.

The Americans led by two matches to one at the start of the day's play. Mrs. Margaret Osborne Dupont of Wilmington, Del., quickly extended the margin to 3-1 by trouncing Mrs. Betty Hilton, 6-3, 6-4. Miss Brough's victory, which followed, thus supplied the clincher and made mere exhibitions of the two concluding tussles.

Doris Hart of Miami scored easily over Joy Gannon, one of Britain's youthful hopes, 6-1, 6-4, and Miss Brough and Mrs. Dupont teamed to beat Mrs. Hilton and Mrs. Kay Stammers-Merzies, the latter the playing captain of the British team, 6-2, 6-2.

## Baseball Poll Begins Tuesday

CHICAGO, June 13 —(AP)—The nation's baseball fans will begin voting Tuesday to place their favorite Major League players in the 15th annual all-star game in St. Louis July 13.

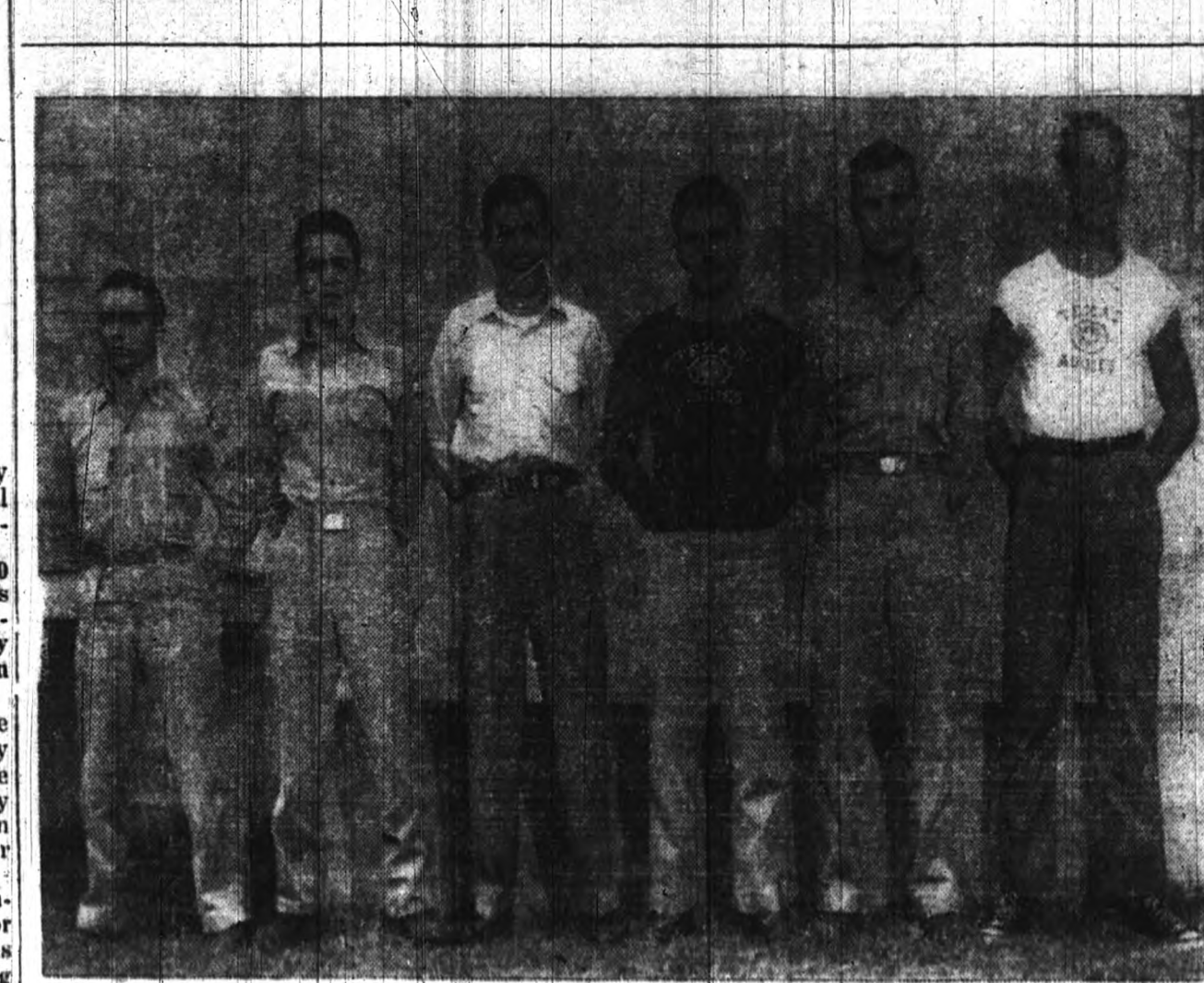

## Ben Hogan Wins National Open With 72-Hole Score of 276

LOS ANGELES, June 13 —(AP)—Ben Hogan, winner of almost every other honor in golf, captured his biggest tournament Saturday at the United States Open Championship.

Stunning a record crowd with a par-breaking performance, Hogan won the championship with a 72-hole score of 276. Par is 284.

The mechanical man of golf, refusing to crack when the pressure came in the final stages, wrecked the par 71, 7,020-yard Riviera Country Club championship course with his performance.

Shooting final rounds of 68 and 69 to go with his first round 67 and second round 72, Hogan steadily and carefully chopped down hopes of his nearest rival, Jimmy Demaret.

Demaret finished second, matching Hogan's rounds of 68 and 69.

Hogan broke the U. S. Open Tournament record for 72 holes, a 2881 registered by big Ralph Guldahl at Detroit in 1937. He also fractured the 54-hole score, too, which was 211.

An estimated 25,000 fans watched the triumph of the 35-year old transplanted Texan from Fort Worth, who now calls Hershey, Pa. home.

Slamming Sam Snead, who led the field going into this final challenge, dropped back with rounds of 73 and 72.

This was Hogan's course. He won the last two rich Los Angeles open tournaments over it in 280 and 275, stripping its par by 13 shots.

He became the first man to win in the same year the U. S. Open and the PGA championships—one medal, the other match play—since Gene Sarazen turned the trick in 1922.
