400 A&M Students Plan to Graduate This Summer

Four hundred men will graduate from A&M this summer, W. E. Street, chairman of the Commencement Committee, announced yesterday.
There will be no graduation ceremonies this summer unless the graduating class wishes to have one. If they do, it will be at the end of the second half of summer school, in August. Otherwise, diplomas will be sent by mail as in the past.

According to Dr. Street, this last graduating class was the biggest and the ceremony itself was one of the best.
Last year it took three hours and twenty-five minutes for 700 men to get their diplomas. This year, 900 men received their degrees in two hours and twenty-five minutes.

Street said that a number of letters were received commending the committee on the excellent manner in which graduation was carried out at A&M.
