## Rent Adjustment Applications May Be Filed After Saturday

Landlords who are operating at a loss, or who can show that they are suffering hardships due to low rentals may apply for adjustments after July 10, the Area Rent Director for the Bryan Defense Rental area, has announced.

"These changes," Tighe Woods, housing expeditor, stated "Will, I believe, remove many of the complaints against the adjustment provisions that some landlords have made in the past.

"The new simplified short form in applying for a hardship adjustment, will take care of small landlords who have not kept books and records which has made it impossible for them to qualify for a hardship increase.

"The only records now needed are tax receipts, insurance premium notices, and fuel and utility bills. If these have been lost, needed information may be obtained from the tax collector's office, insurance agents, or fuel and utility company offices."

Landlords who wish to petition for an increase in rent under this new adjustment provision may obtain the necessary forms from the area Rent Office, Howell Building, Bryan, or Phone 2-1207.

The two regulations are:  
Under a new adjustment provision, no landlord need operate units under rent control at a loss. This is in keeping with the provision in the Housing and Rent Act of 1948 that the Expeditor shall give "due consideration" to landlords operating at a loss.

A small landlord (one who owns not more than four rental units) will have no difficulty in qualifying for a justified hardship adjustment. He will merely have to fill out a simplified short form on which he will show how his net income has fallen because of increased costs of fuel, taxes, utilities, and insurance.

A number of collections have been obtained by exchange. During the past three years, A&M has obtained by this method 1,000 plants from Sweden, 1,000 from California, 1,000 from Washington and Oregon, and approximately 4,000 from army officers who collected overseas during the war. In addition, there are many small but valuable collections of rare plants given by former students and friends.

Tracy Herbarium is highly praised by a majority of the plant collectors in the North and East, and is becoming well known throughout the nation as a source of information about the plants of the Southwest. Still in the process of being built up, the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station has commendable pride in the completion already achieved of the array of valuable typical specimens.
