"The new simplified short form in applying for a hardship adjust-ment, will take care of small land-lords who have not kept books and records which has made it impossible for them to qualify for a hardship increase.

"The only records now needed are tax receipts, insurance premium notices, and fuel and utility bills. If these have been lost, needed information may be obtained from the tax collector's office, insurance agents, or fuel and utility company offices."

Landlords who wish to petition for an increase in rent under this new adjustment provision may obtain the necessary forms from the area Rent Office, Howell Building, Bryan, or Phone 2-1207.

The two regulations are: Under a new adjustment prorision, no landlord need operate units under rent control at a loss. This is in keeping with the provision in the Housing and Rent Act of 1948 that the Expeditor shall give "due consideration" to landlords operating at a loss.

A small landlord (one who owns A small landlord (one who owns not more than four rental units) will have no difficulty in qualifying for a justified hardship adjustment. 


