

American Leaguers Down Favored Nationals 5 to 2

Raschi Leads Junior Circuit To Win; Musial Hits Homer

ST. LOUIS, July 14 —(AP) Vic Raschi singled home two big runs and hurled three scoreless innings yesterday to lead the American League to a 5-2 triumph over its National League rivals in the 15th annual all-star baseball game, finished in the rain.

The game was played before 34,000 shirt-sleeved fans in muggy sweltering heat.

Stan Musial of the St. Louis Cardinals sent the National League of to a 2-0 lead in the first inning with a towering two run homer, his first in five all-star appearances.

The American League reduced the margin to a single run in the last half of the second inning when Hot Evers of Detroit filled a line drive into the left field bleachers for a home run with nobody on base, the first hit off Ralph Branca of Brooklyn.

With one out Branca walked Ken Keltner but retired George McQuinn and Buddy Rosar on out-field flies to end the inning.

Musial's homer was off Washington's Walt Masterson, the starting pitcher for the American Leaguers.

Masterson retired the Nationals in order in the second inning.

The Americans tied the count at 2-2 in the third when Ralph Branca of Brooklyn, who started the contest, experienced a sudden

burst of wildness. James Vernon and Pat Mullin walked, executed a double steal when Tommy Henrich was called out on strikes, and then Vernon scored on an outfield fly.

Three fourth inning runs, two of them on a single by pitcher Vic Raschi, carried the American League into a 5-2 lead over the National loop at the end of four frames.

The bases were loaded in the fourth when Raschi, who followed Masterson to the mound after three innings, singled home Ken Keltner and George McQuinn who also had singled.

The blow chased Johnny Schmitz of the Cubs, second National League pitcher, and brought in Johnny Sain, an 11-game winner with the Boston Braves.

The injured Joe DiMaggio, batting for Pat Mullin, sent a fly to left field, snatching Birdie Tebbets to score easily from third with the fifth run.

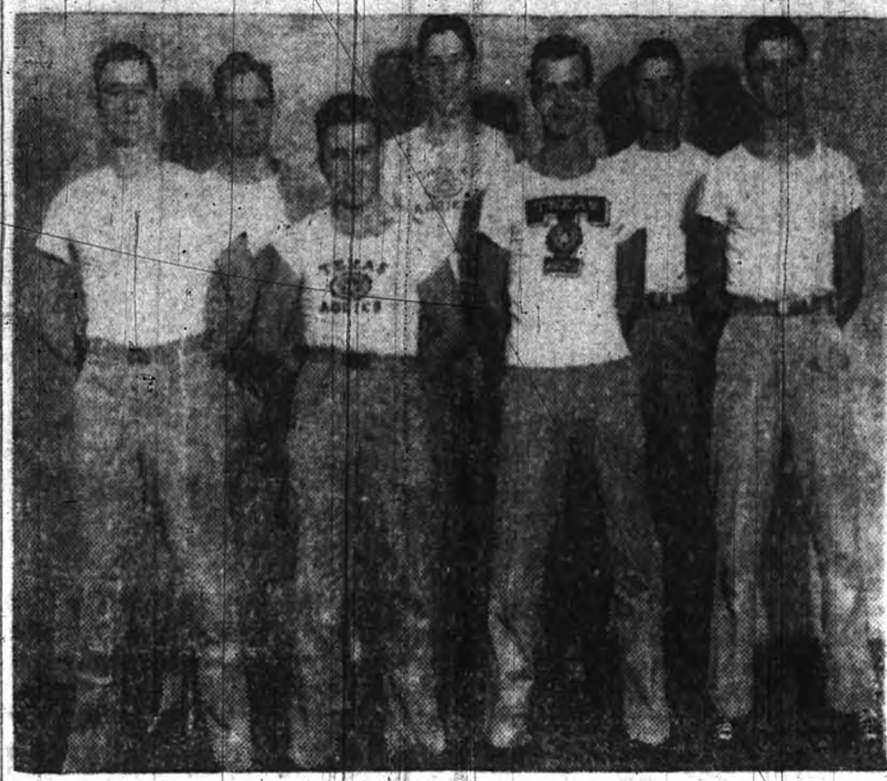
THREE WILL DO

"Bones" Irvin Boasts Enviably Record in Football And Track

Ex-Aggie Barlow "Bones" Irvin, new freshman football and assistant varsity track coach who assumed his duties June 1 is a man well worth knowing. He brings to A&M with him an enviable record in both football and track, not only as a coach, but as a participant in the sports as well.

Irvin first saw A&M in the fall of 1922 when he started his college football career under Dana X. Bible, then coach at Aggie land. He played here through 1925, winning Southwestern Conference honors as a guard.

Jamaica to Lead With a Pair Of Record-Busting Track Aces

KINGSTON, Jamaica — Jamaica is pinning its Olympic hopes on two world names in track — Herbert McKenzie 400 meter world record holder, and long-striding Arthur Wint, whose prowess has done much to make Jamaica's name known.

Wint, 800 meter star George Kspat, the weight lifter, Leslie Laine, a sprinter, McKenzie and his sprinter team-mate Basil McKenzie, are the stars of the team.

McKenzie holds the official world record of 46.3 for 400 meters and has a mark of 46 flat up for official recognition. He is the solid Olympic favorite in his specialty, and also will run in the 200 meters, where he has posted very fast times. McKenzie, Wint and McKenzie will make up three-fourths of the island's 400 and 1600 meter relay teams. Their best chance probably lies in the longer race but they will be formidable competitors in both.

The Jamaican Government has given full support to the bid by this small island for Olympic honors. It has agreed to subscribe half of the 4,000 pounds necessary to finance the team, and the rest is being found from donations by sport-minded business men and organizations. Trial meetings for the team have attracted big crowds, and all Jamaica will be watching the papers with hopes of news of success.

FORT WORTH, Tex., July 14 (AP)—For the second year in a row the Texas League leaders at the half-way mark have been unable to beat a squad recruited from the other seven clubs. Fort Worth's Cats made a gallant fight of it last night but couldn't get by the last inning and the All-Stars won 4-2.

A crowd of 12,636 watched as the All-Stars, managed by Al Vincent of Tulsa, banged out six hits for four runs in the ninth to take the game.

Vincent used six of his seven pitchers while manager Bob Bragan of Fort Worth called on the fifth, Vincent wasn't there at the finish, however. He was thumped out of the game for protesting too vigorously on a decision in the last inning.

The Cats got their runs in the sixth and seventh innings. The first one was on a single by Irv Noron that drove in Marionetti. The next was on a single by Marionetti with the bases filled.

The All-Stars went to work in a hurry in the ninth inning to win the game. Tommy Tatum of Tulsa, pinching for Dibiassi, singled. Johnny Creel of Dallas followed suit and Tom Jordan of San Antonio singled to fill the bases. Reynolds doubled in Tatum and Creel.
