TOKYO, Aug. 6 (P)—Gen. Jonathan Wainwright, retired hero of Bataan, has sent a message to wartime Premier Hideki Tojo absolving him of personal responsibility for mistreatment Wainwright

received while a prisoner, Tojo's attorney said today.

"General Wainwright asked me to deliver this message to Tojo," said George Francis Blewett, Philadelphia attorney who is serving as American counsel for Tojo now awaiting judgement of the in-

ternational war crimes court.
"Wainwright said: Tell Tojo
that as one general to another, I want him to know that I do not hold him personally responsible for treatment I received while a pris-oner of war. I know that as pre-mier and war minister he could not be expected to know about such
