**Four A&M Forest Service Men  
Attend Windbreak Conference**

Four foresters represented A&M at a recent windbreak conference held at Quartz Mountain State park near Mangum, Oklahoma. They were Acting Director D. A. Anderson and Research Technician G. U. Kinneer of the Texas Forest Service, Robert R. Rhodes, instructor in the Range and Forestry department, and C. W. Simmons, Extension Service forester.

About 30 foresters and others interested in the establishment of windbreaks and related problems attended the two-day meeting that included a tour of windbreak plantations in both Texas and Oklahoma. The tour was under the direction of Herb Wells, U. S. Soil Conservation Service authority on windbreaks from Oklahoma City. Prominent among those present were C. F. Evans, Assistant Regional Forester, U. S. Forest Service, Atlanta, Ga., Homer C. Mitchell, Regional Forester, Soil Conservation Service, Ft. Worth, and State Foresters Donald E. Stauffer of Oklahoma, Fred Lang of Arkansas and George White of Missouri.

The A&M group inspected windbreaks in Kiowa, Greer and Washita counties in Oklahoma as well as similar plantings in Wilbarger, Foard, Childress, Hemphill, Collingsworth and Wheeler counties in Texas.

They also visited the U. S. Department of Agriculture experiment station at Woodward, Oklahoma, where some seedlings are grown for experimental windbreak plantations.

Howard R. Oliver, senior EE student from Dallas, was elected President in last night's organizational meeting of Tau Beta Pi, first National Honor Fraternity to be installed among A&M undergraduates.

Forty-four engineering seniors who were chosen from members of the Scholarship Honor Society, elected officers, adopted a set of by-laws, and concluded other business in preparation for an initiation banquet to be held Oct. 11.

The purpose of the long-sought organization was quoted by Dean H. W. Barlow from the Chapter's charter as "To mark in a fitting manner those who have conferred honor upon their alma mater by distinguished scholarship and exemplary character as undergraduates in engineering."

Other officers elected included R. L. Shannon, Vice-President; M. G. Simmons, Recording Secretary; B. J. Shields, Correspondence Secretary; E. C. Livingston, Treasurer; and W. B. McDaniel, Cataloguer.

To be initiated at the same time in the October ceremonies will be 32 members of the class of '22. In 1922 this group was granted a charter of Tau Beta Pi, but were forced to return it before they were initiated.
