

War Hymn Gains Popularity With Yankee Music Lovers

The Aggie War Hymn is about to make the Hit Parade. According to reports from around the country, the War Hymn is quite popular among some of the Yankee brethren.

A letter was received recently from a War Hymn fan in Michigan. Charles F. Albrecht of Detroit considers the War Hymn quite a piece of music. He first heard it as the theme song on a record session from radio station CKLW in Detroit. "So I now write you as a last resort hoping you can tell me where I can get a recording of your college song for my record collection. . . . The one they play as the theme song sounds grand as they break into it at the end of the program. I think it must be played by the Aggie Band?"

Albrecht unknowingly blundered into blasphemy when he went on to say, "I think the record would have a good enough sale to warrant the production of it with another Texas song on the reverse side, possibly 'The Eyes of Texas' or some other well known Texas song similar to the Aggie War Hymn."

"Please look into this matter for me and maybe in the near future we can repay the favor by a tour of your state and if possible move there, as we are getting older and

would like to locate in a warm, pleasant climate."
Albrecht lives at 9923 Holmur St., Detroit 4, Michigan, and a copy of the Aggie War Hymn will soon be on its way to his record collection. He will also be sent a copy of *Chances*, the football schedule, corps trip notices, and a picture of "Pinky" Downs.
