"I urge your support of this new, to some daring, and yet essentially sound evangelistic plan," he said.

The commercial announcement will differ only from competitors' in that it has nothing to sell except an opportunity to become better acquainted with the Episcopal Church.

## Edwards Winner Of Senate in Dorm II

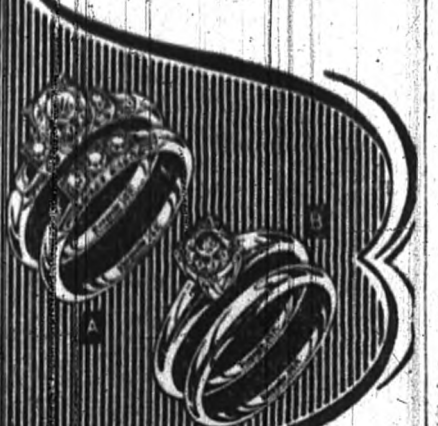
George R. Edwards has been declared winner of the election for Student Senator in Dorm II by the Election Committee.

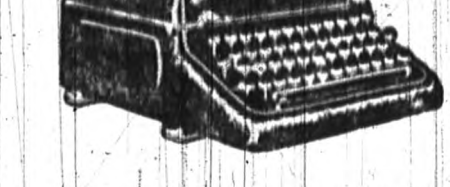
