



LEO R. "DUTCH" MEYER, TCU COACH

## Meyer, Dean of SWC Coaches, Specializes in Good Passers

Leo R. (Dutch) Meyer head mentor of the TCU football team for the last fourteen years is starting out another season at his Alma Mater. The Dutchman, as he is often called, has been head coach at his school longer than any other person at another school in the Southwest Conference.

Coach Meyer joined the athletic staff of TCU in 1923 as freshman mentor, a position he held for eleven years until he was promoted to head coach in 1934. As a student and coach, the Dutchman has been active in the Frogs sport life for 30 years.

To the fans, The Dutchman has perhaps been most well known as the master of the forward pass; for he is the man who produced such greats as Sammy Baugh and Davey O'Brien.

Since he became head coach at TCU, more than forty per cent—six of his fourteen teams—have gone into bowl games. The 1938 Frog eleven, probably the best known TCU team in football was declared national championships and two others (1935 and 1936) finished in the top five in national ratings.

Probably the most reflecting example of his great coaching ability is the remarkable series of upsets which his teams have scored. In at least four seasons his Frog teams have scored the nation's upset of the year by spoiling the records of undefeated and untied

teams then rated as the nation's No. 1 team.

The most recent upset was last season when the Mustangs had to come from behind to gain a 19-19 tie with the TCU squad.

"Dutch" Meyer's best season at TCU was probably in 1938, the year of the "Grand Slam" in which his team went through the season undefeated and untied to be named the national champions as well as Southwest Conference champions. That season he produced three all-Americans: Davey O'Brien, the great quarterback; Ki Aldrich, center on the national champion squad, and I. B. Hale, TCU's greatest tackle.

On the '35 and '36 teams Meyer had two all-Americans, Sammy Baugh, who is now a top paid pro star, and Darrel Lester.

It was in these years, from 1934 to 1938, when Coach Meyer for five seasons in Baugh and O'Brien had the men generally known to be the nation's No. 1 passers that The Mighty Dutchman became nationally known as the country's foremost expert on the art of forward passing.
