## Aggies to Repeat Last Year's 26-0 Defeat at Hands of TCU

FORT WORTH—Oct. 14—Dick Peebles, sports editor of the San Antonio Express, figured it all out in his story last Sunday. Mr. Peebles says "TCU beat Texas A & M, 26-0 last year and this week's game at Kyle Field will be a repeat performance" of the 1947

game. Knowing that when one team makes four touchdowns and the other club can't score it all adds up to a pretty dull football game, Peebles has passed up the Aggie-TCU tilt and doubtless will go to Austin to see a "real" football game between Arkansas and Texas.

Here's how Peebles figures things will go out at Kyle Field Saturday.

Tri-Capt. Jim Winkler and Odell Stautzenberger really don't appreciate the honor of having been chosen to lead this year's Aggies, so in the first quarter Winkler will lay down and let the Frogs' Pete Stout run past him. Hub Ellis won't choose to run the risk of getting his other cheek hurt, so he and Stautzenberger will play dead and so will halfback Bart Halton and safety Bob Goode. Stout goes on for a touchdown. Ledker kicks point and it's 7-0, TCU.

Lindy Berry will run Charley Wright, Andy Hillhouse and Wray Whittaker dizzy on the ends in the second quarter, running flat over the outstretched body of linebacker Bob Bates for another TCU tally.

The Aggies haven't the stuff to stage a comeback so they'll play dead while TCU racks up two more touchdowns in the last half.

The Cadets scored twice each in their first four games, but this time Royalty won't even try Goff and Goode won't run hard.

## A&M, TCU Players To Hold Reunion On Kyle Field

Several of the Aggies will be playing against former high school teammates now at TCU. End "Cup" Copeland will match skills against Frog Guard "Red" Marble when he played with at Waco High. Dwayne Tucker, also from Waco, played with Marble and Copeland. All three men were under the direction of Coach Stiteler at Waco.

"Tuck" Chapin of Jefferson High, San Antonio, will also be playing opposite George Boal, end for TCU. Oddly enough, both players were then under the tutelage of Barlow "Bones" Irvin, present freshman coach.

Coch Marty Karow will be the guest speaker at the Quarterback Club meeting tonight. Karow has coached the Horned Frogs twice this year, and has a satchel full of notes on TCU's offensive and defensive tactics.

The meeting will start at 7:00 in the Assembly Hall, a half-hour earlier than usual. Picture will be of the A&M-LSU football game will be shown following Karow's talk.

The amiable basketball coach is a colorful talker, and will probably be able to outline the offensive tactics to be used by the Frogs. His only statement yesterday was "They'll be hard to beat."

On his desk was a set of TCU statistics which showed that Lindy Berry has carried the ball 51 out of 192 plays for the purple and white.

ROY POTTS won the Quarterback Club contest last week with five out of six games called correctly, in spite of the many upsets. His guesses are as follows: LSU 34-A&M 7; Arkansas 0-Baylor 14; Rice 7-Southern Cal 20; SMU 41-Missouri 7; Texas 6-Oklahoma U. 7; TCU 20-Indiana 14.

His only mistake was made on the SMU game, which every entry missed.

Out of approximately 150 entries, only two men picked at least four winners. J. H. Lien was the only other guesser besides Potts. Lien picked four, but loyalty to A&M was his downfall, because that was the only game besides the SMU game which he missed.

## Farmers Planning Defensive Tactics for Berry and Stout

Secret practices are scheduled for the Aggies today and tomorrow, according to a statement made yesterday by Coach Charlie DeWane. The team was also put through a similar workout yesterday while the team concentrated on preparing for the Horned Frogs passing and running attack.

Spectators are requested to cooperate with Coach Stiteler and not turn out for practice. The Aggies are expected to use a wider variety of plays against the Frogs than they have used in the pre-conference games.

It is no secret, however, that the team is concentrating on its defense to stop the running and passing attack of Lindy Berry and Pete Stout.

The Frogs did not hit their stride until the A&M game last year, and it is very possible that they will have a polished offense for this game.

Yesterday's scrimmage was not as rough as the one on Tuesday because Coach Stiteler is not taking any chances on pre-game injuries.

End "Cup" Copeland received a slight head injury earlier in the week, but will not play unless he loses his headache.

The varsity split into two groups for practice yesterday, with the starting line concentrating on defense and the backfield on offense.

The hardest-working group on the field this week has been the "B" squad, composed mostly of ineligible. Several top men such as Bob Smith, Richard Guardamal and Delmar Sikes spearhead the Bees' attack, and furnish a top-flight offense attack for the line to work against.

The grey-haired Aggie mentor declined to make a statement as to who would win the game, but he indicated that he would be satisfied if the Farmers played as hard this week as they did against LSU. He stated that the whole team was improving by the day.
