"You save the best for a later time," Dean Abbott pointed out. "You are a very distinguished group of students from the Class of '51."

Sophomore students are eligible for membership in this organization if they have a grade point average of 2.5 or better during their freshman year. About 107 members of the Freshman Class of last year qualified for membership in the chapter, Dr. Abbott said.

A request with a petition was initiated last year by Dean Abbott and members of the Class of '51. If three-fourths of the chapters in the United States vote favorably, the local chapter, which will be called the A&M College of Texas Chapter of Phi Eta Sigma, will be accepted as a charter member of the society. Purdue University will also be voted on at that time, Dr. Abbott said.

James O'Brien of College Station was selected as the local delegate to attend a National Convention of Phi Eta Sigma which will meet at the University of Alabama on November 18 and 19. Alfred Martin of Dallas was elected alternate. If the local chapter is accepted, O'Brien's expenses will be paid for out of the national fund.

The next meeting of the group has been scheduled for October 27 in the Physics Lecture Room.

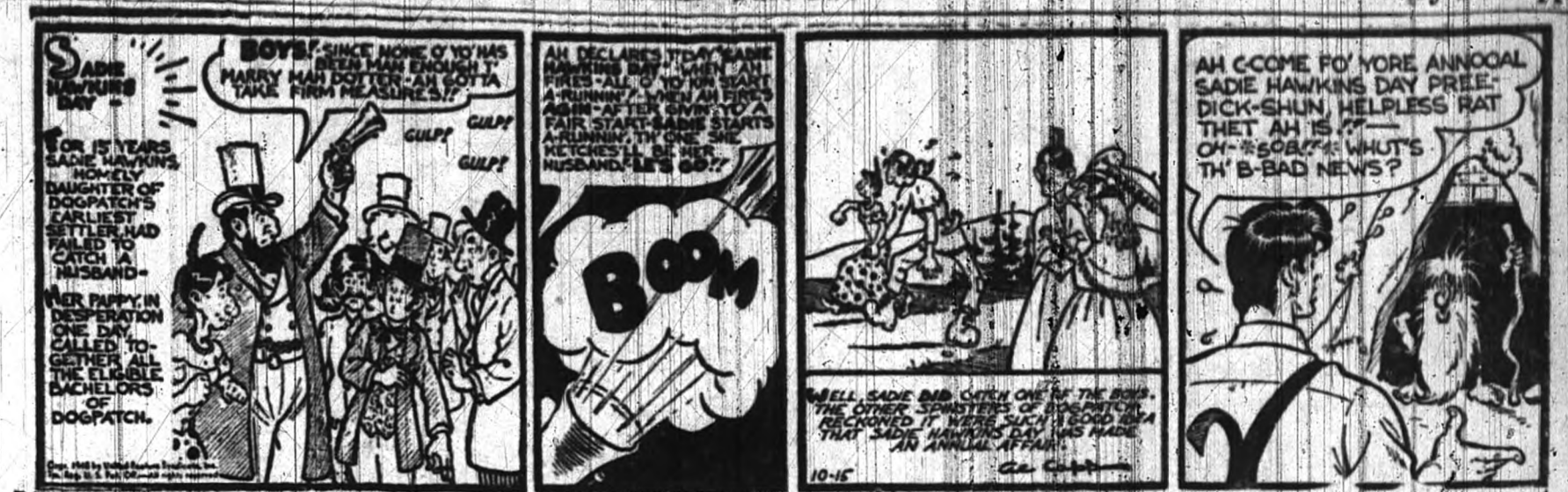
