Baylor Cubs Hosts To Aggie Fish In Waco Friday Night

The Texas Aggie freshman football squad will meet an opponent tougher to beat than any they have met thus far this season when they tangle with the Baylor Cubs in Waco Friday night.

The Baylor team will probably be able to match the speed of the Fish in the starting backfields. The lines will be evenly matched in weight advantage except at the center position where the Cubs' Dick Calhoun will outweigh any of the Fish centers by at least 15 pounds. Calhoun weighs 195 pounds.

The standout performer in the Cub line is tackle Ken Casner of Waco. Casner caused the Texas Shortorns plenty of trouble with his 225 pounds. Casner is the heaviest lad in the Baylor forward wall.

The Fish will have to keep a close watch on end Stanley Williams of Cleco. Williams is the favorite target of passers Robert Reid, Marshall Alford, and Larry Isbell. The other end for the Cubs will probably be Robert Trout of Bowie, who weighs 195 pounds.

Returning to top form after an arm injury hindered his passing during the Shorthorn game is Robert Reid of Houston, the ace thrower for the Waco team. Alford did most of the passing for the Cubs against the Texas team.

Alford had a 47 yard punting average against the Yearling team. That is somewhat better than the best punter on the Aggie squad, Mack Stoeltje, has done this year. Stoeltje has a 42.5 average against the TCU Polliwogs.

The Baylor team beat the TCU Wogs five points more than did the Farmer freshmen. Leading the Cubs in this game was Jackie Bearrow, a 200 pound fullback from Olney.

Bearrow was injured when the Cubs played the Yearlings but is expected to be ready for the Cadet team.

Injured Aggie Team Prepares Defense For Smackover Scott

New Braunfels Averages Fifty Points a Game

NEW BRAUNFELS, Oct. 27.—(AP)—In this neck of the woods, folks, is a football team.

Point a minute boys they are the Unicorns of New Braunfels High School. They have romped to 351 points in seven games and nobody has come close to scoring on them.

They have rolled up almost 4,000 yards rushing and passing and that's better than 550 yards a game.

They beat Alamo Heights of San Antonio 28-0 and Alma Heights only last week tumbled the No. 2 team in the state—Braekenridge of San Antonio—21-0. Guess that makes the Unicorns about 40 points better than Braekenridge.

Braekenridge, you will recall, lost to Port Arthur, the team that's rated No. 1 in Texas, only 14-6.

New Braunfels won't be playing Port Arthur, although local fans sure wish the Unicorns could. New Braunfels is in the class A division; Port Arthur is in Class AA.

Guess New Braunfels will have to be satisfied with the Class A state championship.

Last week the Unicorns beat Lockhart 40-0. That was supposed to be their toughest opponent of the season. The championship of district 24-A rested on the outcome.

Unicorn boosters are not loathe to tell you that Coach Weldon Bynum has 25 starters on his squad, each capable of being a 48 minute man of the highest calibre.

But with all those top gridders, the team is not without its "big gun." He's Jerome Binsell, a 176 pound senior who this year has made 13 touchdowns and 36 points after touchdown for a total of 114.

Tigers Visit Lott For Game Friday

The A&M Consolidated Tigers take on Lott this Friday night at Lott, in what promises to be another lopsided Consolidated victory.

In district competition this year, the Tigers have racked up 118 points to their opponents 12. They methodically rolled over Riesel 28-0, Bremond 39-6, and Chilton 53-0. This promises to be another breather for the Tigers if comparative scores mean anything. Bremond, whom the Tigers whipped 39-6, beat Lott 28-0. However, Boots Simmon's boys are not over confident. As with every other team they have faced, Lott would rather beat Consolidated than any other eleven on their schedule.

Consolidated came out of last week's fracas with no serious injuries. Tiger fullback Sonny Prewitt is still nursing his bad leg, and sat out the game on the bench in the Chilton contest last week.

an injury-ridden Texas A&M football squad held a secret practice on Kyle Field yesterday afternoon in preparation for the Arkansas Razorback game. Lost for the season on the Aggie squad in Saturday's game at Waco was the hard luck kid of A&M, John Christensen.

Last year when Christensen first began impressing the coaches, he was hit in the mouth and had to drop football for the rest of the season. After starting at the bottom again this fall, the Galveston lad finally won a starting position at half-back before the Baylor game.

He did play the entire TCU game on the defense and no passes were completed in his sector. The first offensive play against the Bears of Waco found Christensen in the Cadet lineup.

And then it happened. After suffering one injury and leaving the game, Christensen re-entered the struggle only to be re-injured. After the game it was discovered that he had a cracked vertebra and a bruised kidney.

Fullback Bobby Goff and Guard Odell Stautzenberger were re-injured in the Baylor game but both might be ready for the Razorbacks this Saturday.

Tackle Jim Winkler and end Wray Whittaker are expected to be ready to go Saturday.

Back Ralph Daniel, who was carried from the game Saturday, was reported to be ready again. Bobby Dew, veteran halfback, came out of the Bruin game with no injuries and will probably see plenty of action in the next few games if he has no further trouble with his knee.

In Tuesday's secret sessions the Aggies concentrated on finding ways and means to stop Clyde "Smackover" Scott, the leading ground gainer in the conference. In order to stop the Razorbacks a team first has to stop this Arkansas Traveller.

Scott has gained 500 yards in sixty-three carries so far this season. He practically beat the TCU Horned Frogs by himself according to most observers. One said that the Frog ends would start for the sidelines at the snap of the ball but the Olympic hurdler would still sweep outside them.

The Smackover Kid, now in his sixth year of college football, won the Conference dash championship last year when he upset Charlie Parker in the meet at Houston.

The Razorbacks are also hurt by injuries with guard Theron Roberts and end Jim Cox out for the season. Roberts hadn't played this season but was expected to be ready for the Aggie game. An examination revealed, however, that he would participate in no games this season.

Arkansas' Clyde Scott Is Having Greatest Season

The University of Arkansas has lost two of its five games this season but it's no fault of their star back, Clyde (Smackover) Scott. The Razorback hurdling halfback is having his greatest season yet.

Every Saturday at game time, each team that has faced Arkansas has its defense geared to stop Scott, but no opponent has been able to stop the "Smackover Kid" completely. He is probably the nation's fastest griddy, having tied the world record in the 100 yard dash last spring.

Scott has carried the ball 63 times for a total of 500 yards and in addition has completed six of fourteen passes for another 103 yards.

Each Saturday afternoon the Arkansas star finds a variation of defenses thrown against him. Texas, for instance, threw a floating eight man line against him and as a result was able to beat the Razorbacks 14-6.

This season Scott has scored five touchdowns, all against conference foes, but this still doesn't reflect his ability. Several times he's set up scores with long runs and then called on a teammate to carry the ball over the double stripe from only a few yards out.

Coach John Barnhill considers Scott the greatest running back that he has seen. If his speed, power and sidestepping ability doesn't get him past a defender, he calls on his hurdling form to get away. Against TCU Scott scored one of his three touchdowns by hurdling over two Horned Frog halfbacks.
