

Engineer to Speak To ASCE Tonight On Opportunities

Col. Bernard L. Robinson of the Engineers will be guest speaker this evening at a meeting of the A&M chapter of the American Society of Civil Engineers.

A native Iowan, Col. Robinson was graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1920 and was commissioned upon graduation as a second lieutenant in the Field Artillery. Shortly thereafter, he transferred to the Corps of Engineers. In 1922 he graduated from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute with a degree in civil engineering.

Col. Robinson was assigned to the Corps of Engineers from 1922 to the start of World War II, at which time he served in the southwest Pacific Theater. He commanded a special engineering brigade which was responsible for planning and construction required to support combat troops in the Leyte campaign.

Since the war Col. Robinson was stationed in Hawaii as planner and instigator of postwar construction.

For the past year the engineer officer has been district engineer for the Galveston district, directing river and harbor improvement, flood control, and water conservation improvements.
