However, he is not expecting the roof to fall on the Aggies Saturday, even if some piester drops down.

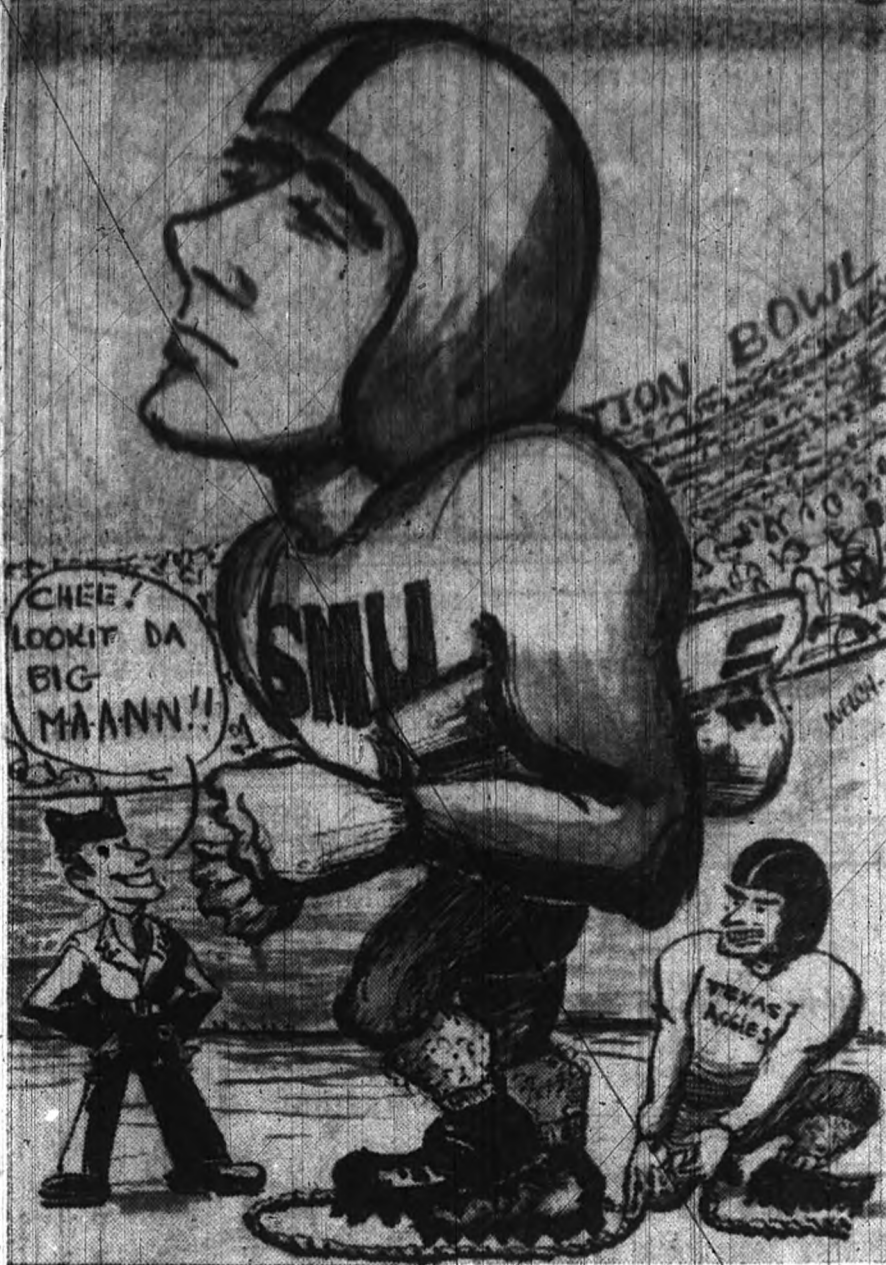
Everyone is invited to hear Stiteler talk tonight.

Baylor Seeks First Win Over TU Since 1939

WACO, (Sp)—Baylor's surging Bears, almost unanimous choice for the last place in the Southwest Conference in pre-season guessing advanced into the seventh week of play this week as the only undefeated club in the circuit.

However, this week the Bears face their biggest hurdle thus far when they meet the big, tough Texas Longhorns in Waco Saturday afternoon. The Bears have not won a game from Texas since 1939, even though they did tie the Steers in 1941 in one of the biggest surprises ever to occur in Southwest conference football.

Aggies, Bears Clash Tonight In Water Polo

A&M's Water Polo team will meet its final home appearance of the season here tonight when it meets the Baylor Bears in the P. L. Downs Jr. Natatorium. The B team match will start at 7 p. m., and the varsity squads will clash at 7:40.

The Bears will try to break the Aggies' 40 game conference winning streak. A&M's Water Polo team has never been beaten in conference play since the sport started here in 1934, the year Coach Art Adamson arrived here.

Last week the Bruins went down before The Texas University swimmers, but are expected to give the Cadets a good workout. Last year the underrated Bears gave A&M a scare before going down, 5-4, in a nip and tuck contest.

He was named by the athletic publicity director of the seven Southwest Conference schools in the newspaper's weekly poll.

The award came after his fine performance in Baylor's 6-3 victory over Texas Christian last week.

Rodeo Champions Seek More Laurels

Champion cowboys of the Aggie Rodeo will compete in the intercollegiate rodeo on November 4, 5, and 6 at Sul Ross College, Jack Kingsbury, president of the Saddle and Siroloin Club has announced.

Nine men will represent the A&M Saddle and Siroloin Club. Three of the men will compete in the various riding events. They are J. R. Day, all-around cowboy; Lloyd Griffith, saddle bronc riding champion; and Maxie Overstreet, bareback bronc riding champion.

Charlie Rankin, ribbon roping co-champion, Jack Kingsberry, champion calf roping; Bill Soyar, ribbon roping co-champion; Bill Moore, Sid Lanier, and Olive Nete will compete in the roping events.

A hand-tooled saddle will be awarded the all-around cowboy, and hand made cowboy boots will be given to the champion in each of the various events. Kingsberry said.

Tigers Will Play Calvert Trojans For Championship

With the district championship at stake, the A&M Consolidated Tigers tangle with the Calvert Trojans tomorrow night at Tiger field, in what will be the Tiger's toughest game this year.

The Tigers are riding on a five game winning streak, including

four district victories. A win over Calvert, whom the Tigers have not beaten since 1944, would assure them of a bi-district game also, and possibly a regional game.

Last year the Tigers went into bi-district against the Trojans, and lost ten first downs to nine after the game had ended in a 6-6 tie and the penetrations were tied two all.

This season the Trojans have racked up wins over Hearne, whom they beat 19-13, Bryan "B" 13-12, Sharp 33-6, Chilton 47-6, and Lott 46-0. Their only setback was against Franklin, who smashed them 32-0. The main threat to Consolidated will be Trojan fullback Nick Gregory and quarterback Wilbert Dick.

Gregory weighs in at 190 pounds and will give the Tigers plenty of trouble with his bruising line plunges. Dick can pass as well as run, and is currently leading the district in scoring.
