

# Bolton To be Inaugurated As President of A&M Nov. 18

Dr. F. C. Bolton will be installed formally as the fifteenth president of A&M November 18. Ceremonies will be held on Kyle Field at 2 p. m.

Chancellor Gibb Gilchrist will install Dr. Bolton as president. Dr. Charles E. Freley, president Iowa State College, will deliver the address. The Iowa president is a graduate of A&M, class of 1919.

Classes at the annex (freshmen) will be dismissed for the day and classes on the main campus will be dismissed at 10 a. m.

The general program calls for registration of delegates at the YMCA at 9:30 a. m. A review of the quiet corps will be held at 10:45 on the main drill field. Luncheon for official delegates and faculty will be held at noon at Shisa Hall.

The robing will be at 1 o'clock in the gymnasium and at 1:40 the Academic procession will begin. The ceremonies will get underway at 2. At 4 a reception will be held at Bolton's home for guests, staff and friends.

"The staff of the college will pay tribute to President F. C. Bolton at his inaugural on November 18, as the fifteenth president of the A&M College of Texas," M. T. Harrington, acting dean of the college, said in a statement issued yesterday.

"All members of the academic staff will be expected to attend."

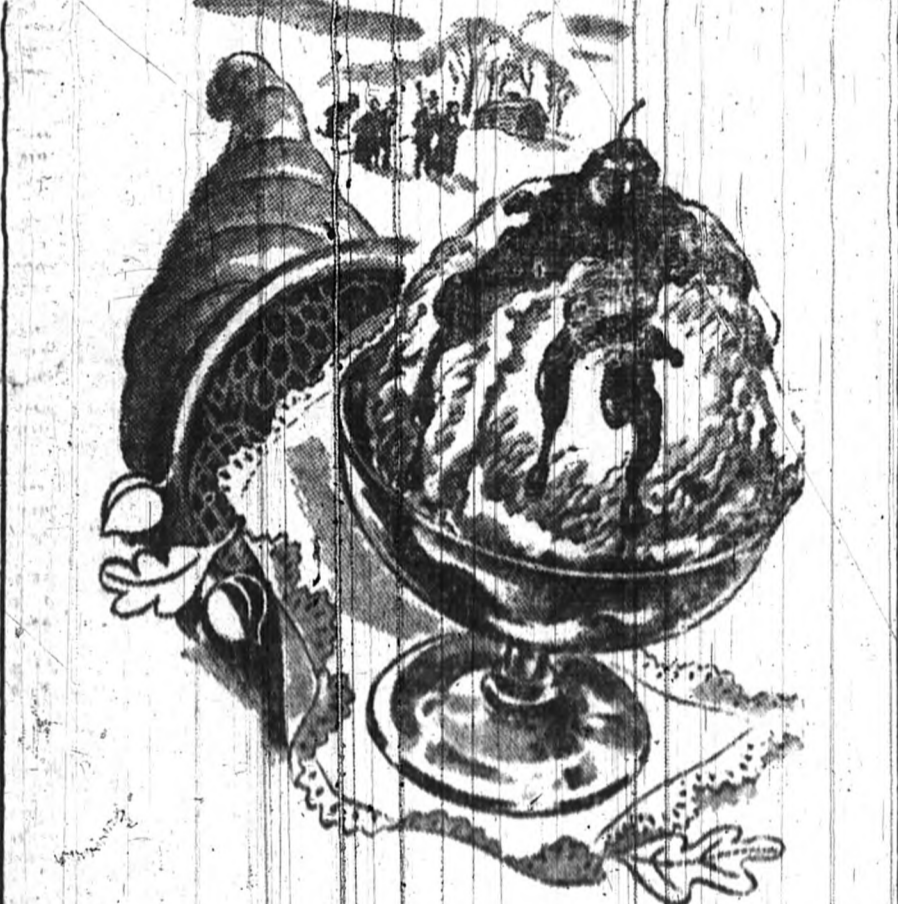

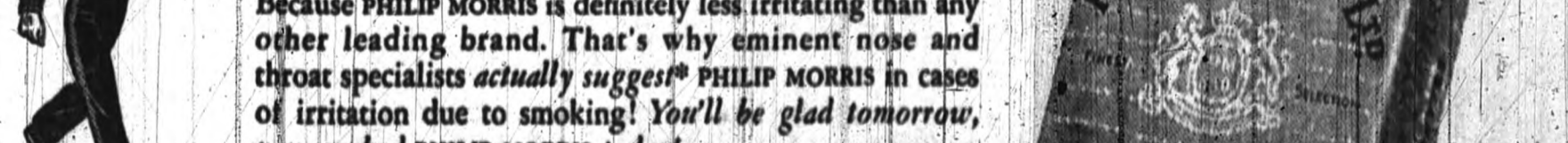
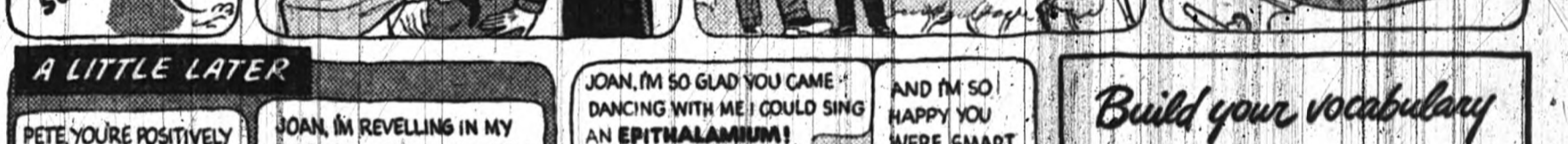
