**GREEK REDS CLAIM NEW VICTORIES**

LONDON, Dec. 13.—(AP)—The Communist Guerrillas of Greece claimed tonight they have recaptured most of the northern Gannos Mountain hideouts from which the Greek army drove them in long, hard fighting last summer. The claim was broadcast by the guerrilla radio and relayed by the Soviet news agency, TASS.

**ManE Conference Highlights Subject Of New Bulletin**

Wage incentives, job evaluation, and time study for industries are chief subjects of Bulletin No. 104 which has just been released by the Experiment Station of the A & M System.

The bulletin, entitled "Proceedings of the First Annual Management Engineers Conference," features speeches by authorities from industry who appeared as speakers on the program of the conference sponsored by the A&M Management Engineering Department.

Profit planning, profit sharing, cost control, labor-management, production, and personnel phases of management engineering are also discussed in the bulletin.

Management engineering, it is pointed out, has an important part in maintenance of the economic stability of the various industries and that participation in the annual conference at A&M will stimulate the industrial progress of Texas generally for the benefit of its citizens.

**Lectures on Meat Preparation Set**

Demonstrations on methods of cooking meats will be given by Miss Edaline Stohr of Chicago, today, tomorrow, and Wednesday. These demonstrations will be held at 7:30 p. m. Monday and Tuesday and at 2 p. m. Wednesday in the Animal Industries Lecture Room.

The demonstrations are primarily for students in meat courses of the Animal Husbandry Department, but they are open for anyone who wishes to attend, according to O. D. Butler of the department.

Miss Stohr is a demonstration agent from the National Livestock and Meat Board in Chicago. This organization represents all branches of the meat and livestock industry and carries out nationwide research and educational programs.

From the results of the research conducted by her own organization and research by colleges, universities, and the Department of Agriculture, Miss Stohr will stress thrifty ways in the purchase and preparation of meats, Butler said.
