French Dynamite Soviet Radio Tower Menacing Berlin Air Lift

BERLIN, Dec. 16, (AP)—The French today blew up the towers of the Soviet-controlled Radio Berlin, knocking the station off the air.
The Russians, however, have another tower outlet, Germany's old Deutschland sender, 20 miles east of the city.

Brig. Gen. Jean Ganeval, French military commander in Berlin, said the two towers were demolished by the French forces this morning. The radio was not on the air at the time.
Ganeval said he was compelled to destroy the towers because they were "a very great danger" to allied airlift planes coming in by radar to the new Tegel field in the French sector. The towers were

near the field.
The French commander said he had notified the Berlin radio station management on Nov. 20 that the demolition would take place today in order to allow the management time to arrange new installations in another sector. He said the demolition took place without incident.
German postal authorities said the French not only blew up the radio towers, but also the control installations for the towers.
Demolishing the towers eliminated a long four-power dispute over Radio Berlin.
The radio station itself is located in the British sector. The Russians have successfully resisted British efforts to force them from the station, which they took over when Berlin fell.
Today's French action came as a surprise to many, although the French communiqué said Berlin Radio had been warned in advance.
In his statement Ganeval said that since Tegel Airfield began operating at full capacity under the airlift planes have been coming and going under all weather conditions.
"Now radar is working," Ganeval said, "but since the planes are flying without visibility, the two large towers of Radio Berlin which stand in the immediate vicinity constitute a very great danger for allied planes. I could no longer accept responsibility for possible accidents. Consequently I executed today a decision taken some time ago to demolish the towers."

Advanced Cadets Payroll Is Higher
A&M advanced cadets on the military payroll drew \$224,745 during the months from October 1, 1947 to October 30, 1948, according to figures furnished by Col. H. L. Boatner, commandant. The money was paid as subsistence allowances for men with advanced contracts at a rate of 79 cents a day.
