

Fifty New Bucking Horses Added to Fort Worth Show

Fifty new bucking horses, including four ranked with the famous "Five Minutes to Midnight," will be displayed at the Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show rodeo in Fort Worth January 28 through February 6.

Tops among the new buckers are "Remember Me," "The Old Gray Mare," "Frontier Days" and "Pomroy."

Four speciality acts featuring performers never before seen in the Fort Worth arena will be the added attraction. Eleven-year-old Don K. Reynolds of Van Nuys, of California, will do trick riding and roping, using a Shetland pony and a pair of matched Palominos.

Capt. William Heyer of Sarasota Florida, will present his famous dancing mare, "Starless Night." Oldtime square dances will be performed on horseback by the Boom Town Mounted Square Dancers of Burk Burnett, Texas. The Pope Pony Hitch, eight Shetland ponies owned and driven by E. O. Pope of Fort Worth, will execute figures at full speed.

Trick riders will be Dick Griffith, Scottsdale, Arizona; Tad Lucas, Fort Worth; Bernice Dossey, Chandler, Arizona; Don Wilcox, Tulsa, and Charlotte Reynolds, Van Nuys, California.

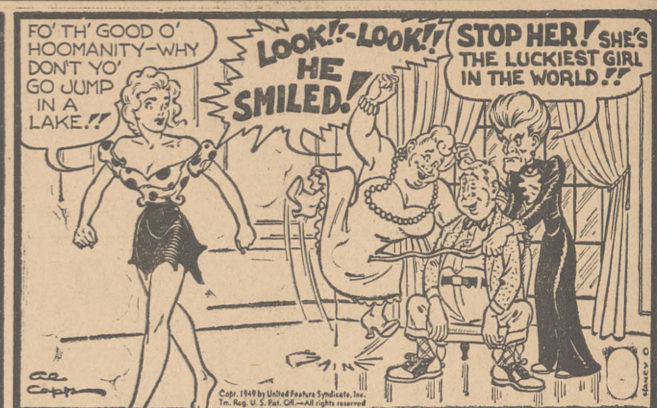
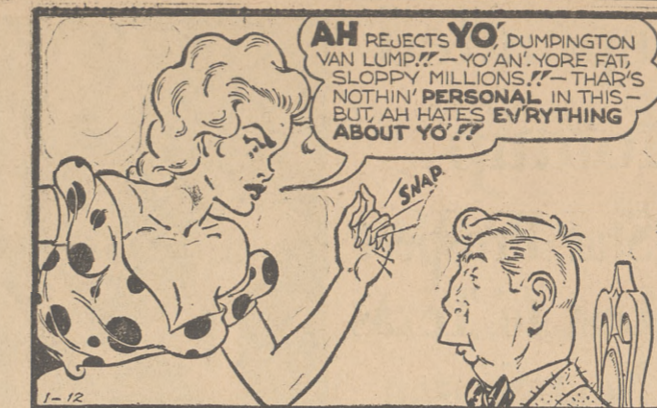
