Pad-locked Pot of Gold . . .

Citizens' Cash Still Safe As Bankless Vault Stands Alone

In case your \$6.66 for incidentals is running out, there is plenty of money for everyone in the small concrete house on the west side of the Student Co-op. All you have to do is get into the building, get the money, and get out of the country. Simple enough, eh?

It is easier said than done. That innocent, apparently vulnerable edifice is none other than the College Station State Bank's vault. Vice-President Harold Sullivan, said that forced entrance is practically impossible.

"The vault is built of reinforced concrete, and it has the most modern time-lock door available. In addition, there is another vault inside, also of the time-lock variety, which houses all the cash," Sullivan said.

When the bank was first built, the vault was permanently installed, and the building was to be constructed around it. However, the government froze the necessary materials, and a prefabricated hut was temporarily used.

Now the materials are available, and construction has begun. "With good weather," Sullivan said, "we should be able to move into the new office by the first of April."

Plans for the new building call for a 40 x 60 feet concrete tile building with a mezzanine, which will contain a lounge and executive offices.

In the meantime, business is transacted in a real estate office two doors east of the former office. Money is carried over every morning by armed guards who protect the depositors' interests twenty-four hours a day.

Actually, Sullivan should double his vault guard. It is quite apparent that something is in the wind, because the civil engineering department has revealed that CE 305, strength of materials, has had a record enrollment.

The gloves and pen may be picked up at the operations office in Ross Hall, Sgt. Marion added.

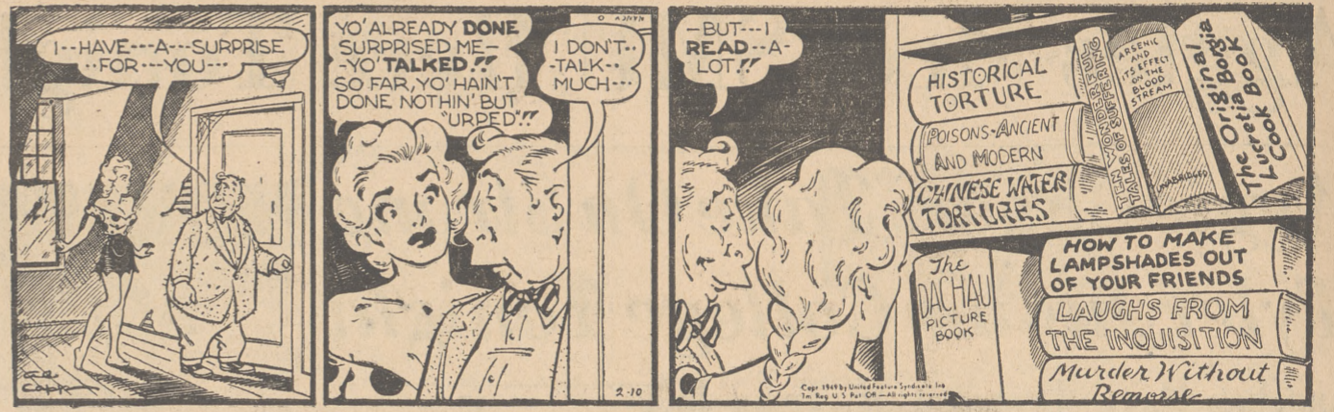
MAGAZINE STAFF MEETS THURSDAY
