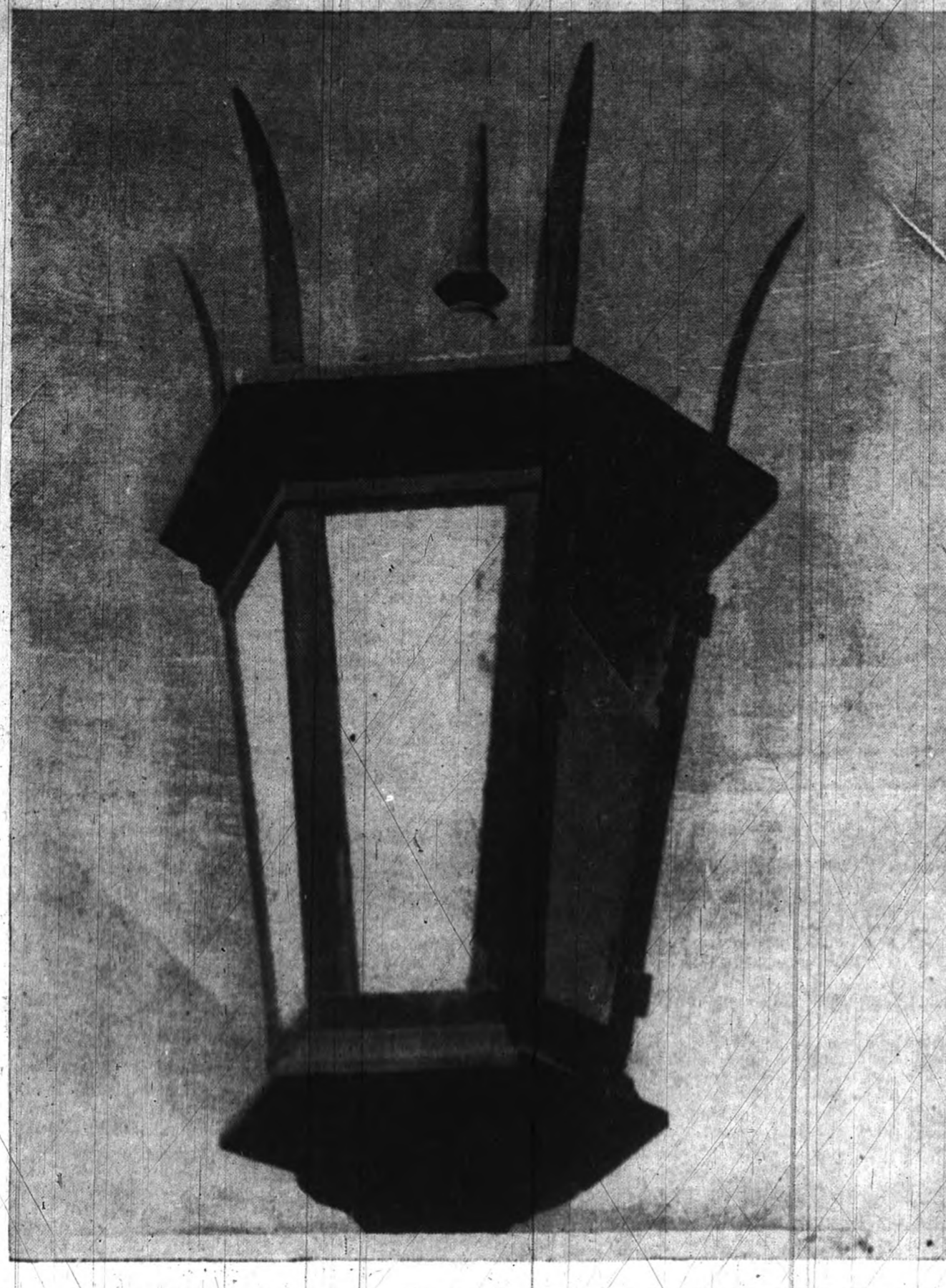

### Proposed Building Already Crowded, Biology Head Says

The new Science Building, existing in plans only, is already overcrowded, according to Dr. C. C. Doak, Biology Department head. Both the Biology and the Entomology Department will occupy the building. Advanced courses in biology will be crowded out. Tentative plans for an Entomology Building across the street between the A&I Building and the new Science Building will alleviate this shortage of space, Dr. Doak said.

Plans for the Science Building have been completed and will be open for bids sometime this month, according to Dr. Doak. The building will consist of three floors; the first will be for freshman work in biology, the second for work in botany and the third will be for zoology and bacteriology. Adequate space and facilities for undergraduate work in bacteriology will be provided. Plans are also being made for an Oceanography Department, Dr. Doak stated.
