 championship mile relay team will try to-and from where we're observing, succeed in taking their 18th consecutive win. Ray Holbrook, Ervin Bilderback, Don Mitchell, and Connie Ludwick will not participate as a team in the intra-squad meet this weekend as they have their positions literally sewed up. A.M.'s regular mile relay teams have now

won 20 of their last 21 races and 32 of their last 34.
 Individual entries for the Relays who will be seen in action this Saturday include Napier, Wilson, and Richardson in the 100-yard dash; and Bill Cardon and Jim Desmuk in the high hurdles. There are no low hurdles in the Austin meet and this event will not be run this weekend. Desmuk is a new track find. He won the intramural hurdles last spring and has been showing up well in practice the past week.
 George Kadera is slated for competition in the discus, shot put and javelin; Ed Hooker in the discus, E. D. Wade in the high jump, L. O. Coleman and J. H. Henry in the broad jump, and Leroy Bodeman, A. Simpson, and Leland Tate in the pole vault. It will be other field event entrants. Relays who will compete tomorrow.
 Fish sprinters probably will run the century Saturday if they have sufficiently recovered from football injuries and gridiron football injuries. Gary Anderson, Karl Hollier, and Robert Shaeffer are among the possible entrants. If the football-trackmen are not ready to go yet, the low hurdles will run in the 220 dash instead of the regular flat land flyers. In such a case, no hurdles will be held.
 The outcome of the fish sprints will determine the make-up of their entries in the pole vault, the 440, 880, and sprint relays in Austin next weekend. J. C. Zern is the only runner who will not have to win his place in tomorrow's tryouts; he definitely will run the half mile leg of the sprint medley.
 Three members of the fish mile relay combination will be decided upon after the tryouts. Ace 440-man James Baker, who will not compete this Saturday, will be the fourth man. Don Graves is slated for the Relays high jump, a newly added event. Buddy Davis will remain at school to catch up on his studies even though he is considered as ranking right with Graves in this event.
 Paul Leming, Bill Bless, and R. B. Farmer are top choices to dominate the Austin high hurdles and may run in the sprint relays as explained above. There will be no low hurdle contest at TU.
