 College Station, Texas
 The Zoning Commission has made the following recommendations:
 That Ordinance No. 38 be amended as follows:
 1. Section No. 5 shall be amended by the addition of Article 9 to read as follows: No detached billboard or sign shall be permitted in District No. 1.
 2. Section No. 6 shall be amended by the addition of the following: No detached billboard or sign shall be permitted in District No. 2.
 3. Section No. 7 shall be amended by addition of the following: No detached billboard or sign shall be permitted in District No. 3.
 4. Section No. 9 shall be amended by addition of the following: No detached billboard or sign shall be permitted in District No. 5.
 5. Ordinance No. 38 shall further be amended by adding the following: In no other section shall a detached billboard or sign be permitted within the city limits of College Station.
 The zoning ordinance provides that any changes in the zoning of areas by published in the local paper, and posted in the area to be zoned, for a period of fifteen (15) days before the City Council acts thereon.
 In accordance, this notice is published and posted, notifying all citizens who may have reason to protest the zoning of this area, that they appear before the City Council, Monday, April 11, 1949, at 7:30 p. m. at the city hall.
