The 5 and 2 Club, composed of freshman veterinary medicine students' wives, met last Thursday in the Cabinet Room of the YMCA.

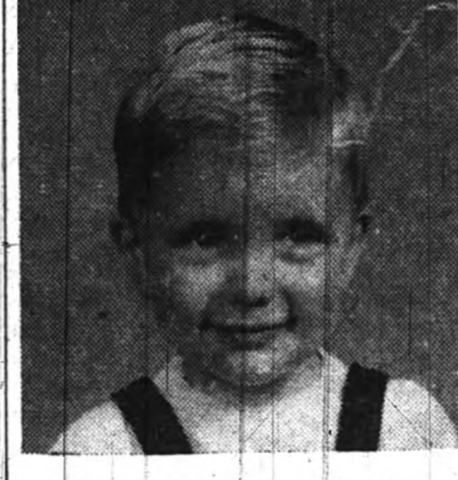
