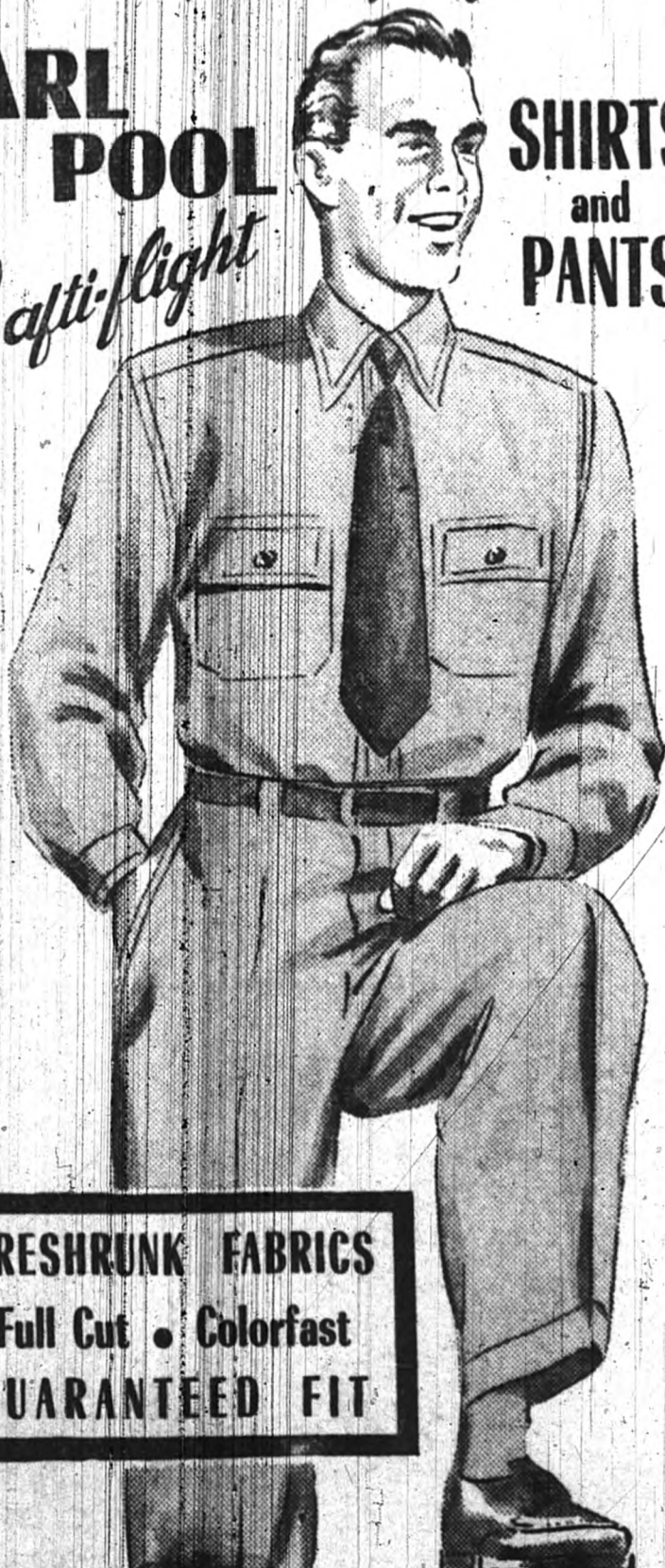

Parents of Bryan Lieutenant to Be Awarded Medals

Medals received by first lieutenant James H. Wilson will be given posthumously today at the Corps Parade at 5 p. m. to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. O. L. Wilson, of Bryan.

Lt. Wilson was awarded the bronze star for meritorious service against the enemy during the period 1944-45. He also received the good conduct medal, the American campaign ribbon, the European-African-Middle East ribbon with three bronze stars, the meritorious unit citation with the numeral two, the victory medal, the army of occupation medal with the German clasp, and the expert rifle and carbine badge.

He entered A&M in 1941 and remained here until 1943 at which time he was called to service. Attending OCS at Aberdeen Maryland, Wilson was commissioned in the ordnance.

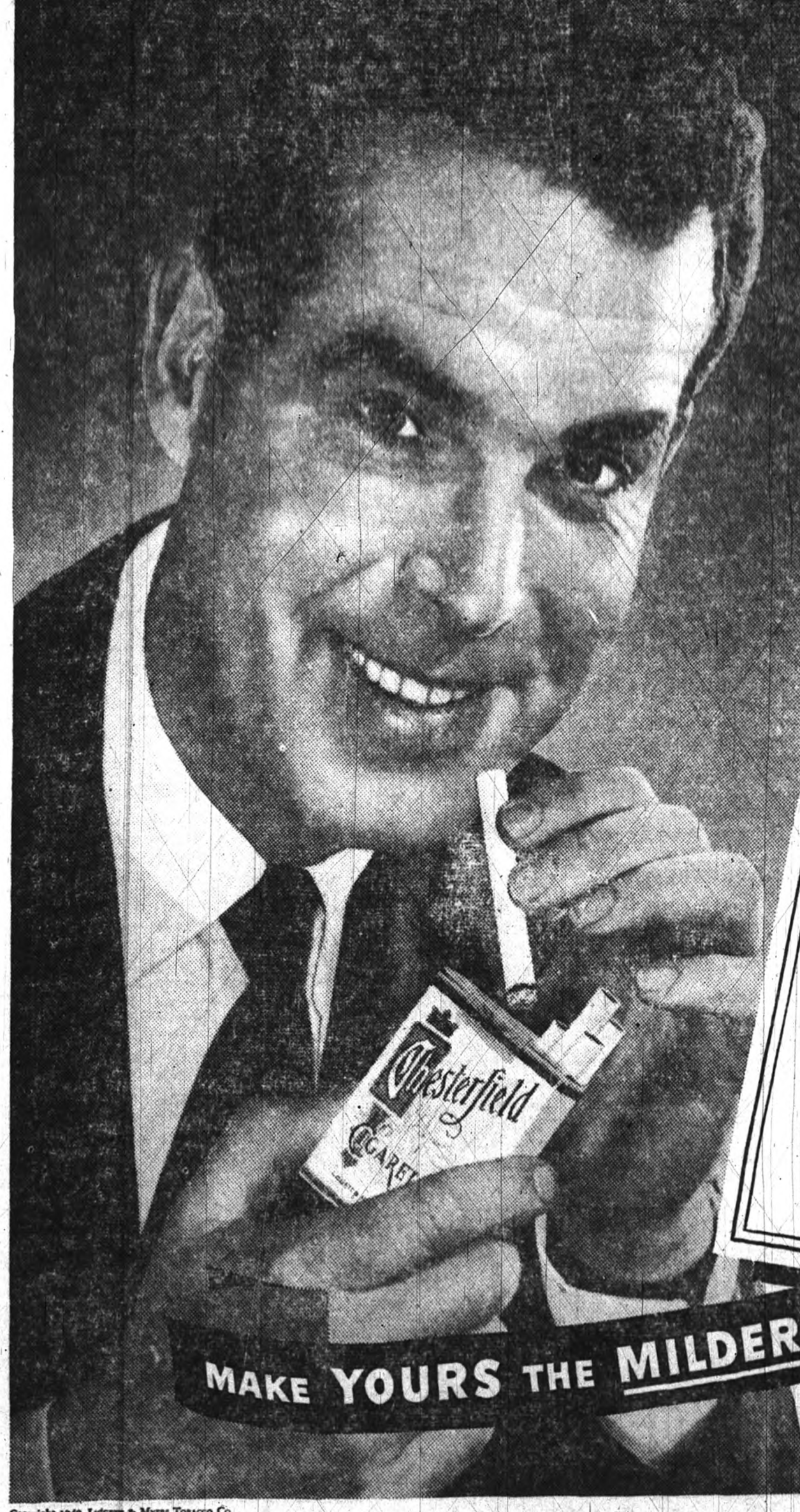
