representative on the Athletic Council are the same with the additional requirement that he must be a member of the Corps of Cadets.

The position of Town Hall manager will be filled by a Senior Class election. Either a cadet or a non-corps student can hold the office of manager. Qualifications for manager are as follows:

He must have a grade point ratio of 1.25.

He must be a classified junior.

He must have the consent of the Director of Student Activities to file an application for the position.

He must have had at least 1 year's experience on the Town Hall staff.

The Town Hall manager is responsible to the Student Life Committee through the Director of Student Activities.

Magazine Editors Named

All applicants for editors of the Commentator, Engineer, Agriculturist, and Southwestern Veterinarian will file with the Student Activities Office and their qualifications will be checked by the election committee. Upon approval a certified list of eligible candidates will be sent to the respective councils who will elect one of the qualified candidates prior to May 4.

Qualifications for an editor of a magazine are the same as those for co-editors of the Battalion and of the Aggieband 1950 except that the student may be either non-corps or a cadet and the applicant does not apply to the Student Life Committee.

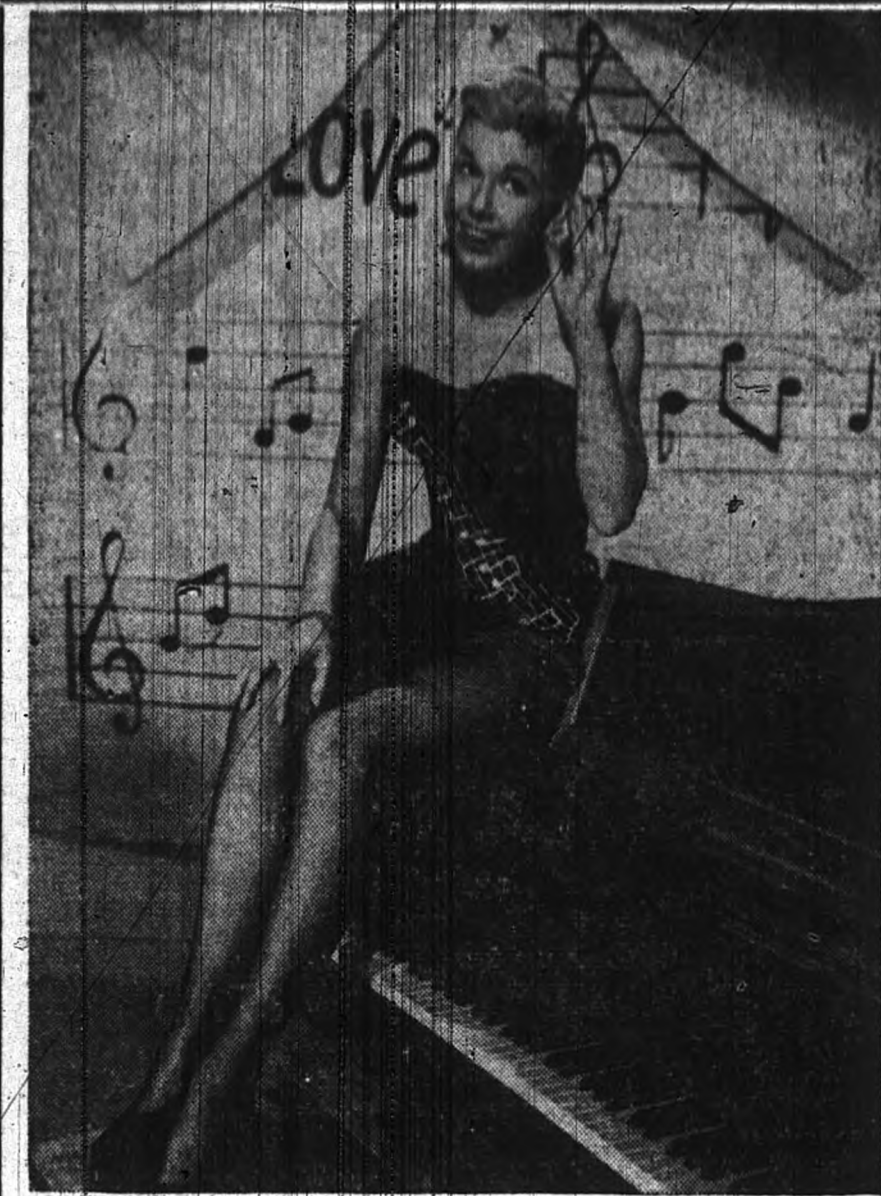
