

Departments Plan Exhibits For Open House Day Program

Open House Day, which will be held on the campus May 7 and 8, will include exhibits by the various departments of the Schools of Arts and Sciences, Veterinary Medicine, Engineering, and Agriculture.

School of Arts And Sciences
The Departments of Biology, Business and Accounting, Chemistry, Economics, Education and Psychology, English, Geography, History, Journalism, Mathematics, Modern Languages, Physical Education, and Physics all plan to have their offices open for visitors from 9 a. m. to 6 p. m. These departments are in the School of Arts and Sciences.

Exhibits planned by these departments include wild and cultivated flowers, skeletons of mammals and living micro-organisms; problems and reports prepared by students; organic and physical chemistry exhibits; exhibits of students papers; and heat, light, and sound exhibits.

Vet Medicine School
The School of Veterinary Medicine also plans to have its building open and will display several phases of veterinary work. The Departments of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery, Physiology and Pharmacology, Parasitology, Anatomy, Hygiene, and Bacteriology will hold several demonstrations of work done by the students. Tours of the Veterinary exhibits will leave the Veterinary Hospital every half hour on May 7.

Plans for the exhibits in the Schools of Engineering and Agriculture have not been released. Dairy husbandry students will present a Spring Dairy Show in the AH Pavilion. The Little Southwestern Livestock show will also be presented on the evening of May 7.

Endurance Fliers Land After Record Breaking 1009 Hours

FULLERTON, Calif., April 27 (AP)—Ending six full weeks in the air, endurance fliers Bill Barris and Dick Riedel landed yesterday.

The wheels of their monoplane touched the asphalt runway at Fullerton Airport at 11:45 a. m. (P.S.T.) They had been in the air 1,008 hours, one minute.

Six weeks was the goal they set when they took to the air March 15 for their fourth try at exceeding the 10-year-old endurance record of 726 hours.

Their three previous failures—once because of magneto trouble, twice because of ice on the carburetor—had been costly, and they were kept in the air only by contributions of \$1 each from some 2,000 Fullerton citizens. The Chamber of Commerce also had chipped in some \$1500 from its surplus cash.

A great cheer arose as a shot from the official timing stand announced that the pair had passed the 1008-hour mark. Immediately, the plane started down on its approach.

The pilots—who alternated at the controls during the long grind—left the plane under their own power and embraced their wives. Then they started walking to the stand. Riedel was out of the plane first.

Both appeared in unexpectedly good physical condition, deeply bronzed by the sun. Both smiled and waved to the crowd. They were bundled into an ambulance to go to a hotel for a physical checkup. Two physicians were waiting.
