

## Guion's 'A Date With Judy' Wallace Beery's Last Picture

A Date With Judy (MGM) starring Jane Powell, Wallace Beery, Elizabeth Taylor (Guion) A Date With Judy is MGM's technicolor peek into an episode in the life of lively teenager Judy Foster, with pert, golden-voiced Jane Powell starred in the title role.

The light and limp plot finds Judy and rich girl friend Elizabeth Taylor, a beauty with a negative family life, vying for the affections of handsome Robert Stack a soda jerk with an Ipana smile and lofty ambitions. Watching the proceedings with a sad and sceptical eye is Oogy (Scotty Beckett), Judy's faithful admirer.

Adding to the plot complica-

tion is married papa Wallace Beery, who is taking rhumba lessons from ultra-energetic Carmen Miranda in order to surprise the "missus" (Selma Royle). Judy walks in on a lesson and gets the mistaken idea that papa is trying to recapture his youth and without assistance from mama.

In this, one of the last pictures before his death, Beery, along with Misses Powell and Miranda, has a role which keeps the film moving at as brisk a pace as the script allows. He is given plenty of opportunity to work his homely face into the familiar contortions and broad smile which Beery fans are and going to miss.

Good for a few drowsy laughs and several ear-pleasing tunes delivered by Powell, Miranda and Xavier Cugat, ADWJ is still, as Judy and Oogy sing in one of the numbers, "strictly on the corny side."

## State Fair Raises Herd Cash Grants

The 1949 State Fair of Texas will pay \$300 for each state herd at the fair this year, the Holstein-Friesian Association of Brattleboro, Vermont announced today.

The management of the show formerly paid only \$100 for each state herd, but this year it is doubling its payment to \$200. This sum added to the \$100 paid by the Holstein Association will bring the payment up to \$300 per herd.

In addition to the new cash grant the fair has increased the premiums for open class Holsteins to \$2,850 plus \$450 for the Texas Holstein-Friesian Special.

Purpose of the added payments is to increase the number of herds shown by out-of-state farms, the Association announced. As a further inducement, the holding time for cattle belonging to out-of-state showmen has been reduced.
