

## College Aid Bill **Defeated By** House Tie Vote

AUSTIN, Tex., May 13 (P). House penny-pinchers yesterday defeated by tie vote an amendment which would have added \$246,000 to the 58 million dollar bill pro-viding funds for state-supported

colleges the next two years. The vote was 62-62 on a pro-posal by Rep. Arthur E. Gromatzky of Priddy to increase the appro-priation for the Texas A&M College Extension Service from \$539,-000 to \$662,000 a year.


Tie votes defeated amendments to bills.

Rep. James K. Presnal of Col-lege Station asked for a \$100,000 a year increase in extension service salaries and \$23,000 more per year for maintenance, equipment and travel.


