Sutton, England, P. Note to the Gibson family (wherever you are): the Vicar checked your bodies today. They're okay—All seven The annual inspection of the Gibson tomb was made on schedule,

as it has been every August 12 since 1793. James Gibson, a wealthy London merchant, had the massive tomb set up in the St. Nicholas Parish churchyard in 1777.

Those were the days of the grave robbing "resurrection men," who dug up cadavers and sold them to the medical schools for the students to dissect. Gibson's daughter Elizabeth was afraid of this. She had heavy iron railings set up around the tomb and sealed the entrance

with a thick door. The door has two massive locks. 


