## English Family Inspected In Their Tombs Annually

Sutton, England, V.P.—Note to the Gibson family (wherever you are): The Vicar checked your bodies today. They're okay—All seven of them.

The annual inspection of the Gibson tomb was made on schedule, as it has been every August 12 since 1793.

James Gibson, a wealthy London merchant, had the massive tomb set up in the St. Nicholas Parish churchyard in 1777.

Those were the days of the grave robbing "resurrection men," who dug up cadavers and sold them to the medical schools for the students to dissect. Gibson's daughter Elizabeth was afraid of this. She had heavy iron railings set up around the tomb and sealed the entrance with a thick door. The door has two massive locks.

When she died in 1793 she left a trust fund to pay for an inspection of the tomb "every August 12 forever."

So today The Rev. W. A. Rhodes went out to the tomb accompanied by his son, Christopher, aged 11, who carried the keys on a crimson cushion.

With two curious women as spectators the Vicar unlocked the door, went inside and inspected the seven coffins.

He found everything in good order. It is generally believed the Gibson family died out long ago but nobody knows for sure.

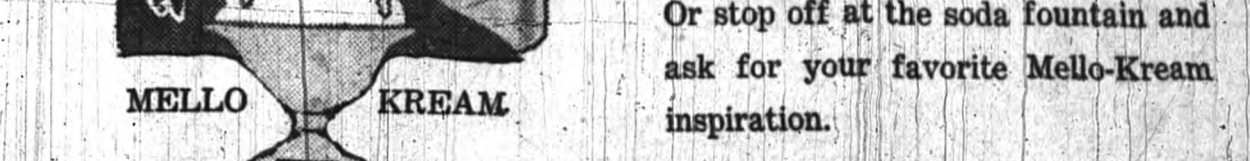
