yard touchdown gallop by Left Halfback Gordon Wyatt. Charles Cusimano covered an LSU fumble over the goal line for the first Tiger touchdown in the third quarter. Chester Freeman ran four yards on a wide sweep for the second LSU touchdown, which occurred in the fourth quarter.

Gordon Wyatt, the left halfback, cut back sharply and went 71 yards for touchdown. James Williams, senior end from Waco, kicked the extra point from placement. Score, Rice 7, LSU 0.

LSU fumbles gave Rice two more chances inside the Tiger 10-yard line in the second quarter, but in the wind and rain, the Owls failed.

**LSU Fumbles**  
LSU, which fumbled itself into several dangerous spots the first half, fumbled its way to a touchdown on the third quarter. Two great runs by Ebert Van Buren, junior halfback from Metairie, La., put the Tigers in position to score.

Bouncing Owls off his hip, Van Buren made one run of 27 yards for a first down on Rice's 18. Quarterback Charley Pevey of Jackson, Miss., passed to Lee Hedges of Shreveport for a first down on the Rice 7. Halfback Chester Freeman of Baton Rouge fumbled the muddy ball when he was hit by Jack Wolcott, Owl end from Houston. The ball squirted over the goal line.

There was a wild scramble. Charles Cusimano, a smart Tiger tackle from New Orleans, covered the ball for a touchdown. Carroll Griffith, quarterback from Little Rock Ark., kicked the extra point.

And the score was tied 7 to 7 at the end of the third quarter.

**Konz Embarrases**  
Ken Konz, LSU quarterback from Welmar, Texas, put Rice in an embarrassing spot by punting out on the Rice 11-yard line in the fourth quarter. The Owls' Harold Riley of Sherman fumbled a 40-yard Tiger Tiger Back Jim Rosseto of Baton Rouge, covered for LSU on the Owls' 16.

Van Buren jarred his way off left tackle to the Rice 1-yard line. Hedges lost four yards. Then Chester Freeman, a fleet sophomore from Baton Rouge, ran almost the width of the field and went over for a touchdown near the flag. Griffith again kicked the extra point.

The Tigers stayed on top the rest of the quarter. And LSU's Billy Baggett had intercepted a Rice pass and was tackled on the Owl 25 when the game ended.

**Sore Throats Lead Morbidity Report**  
Septic sore throat and diarrhea were last week's leaders in the number of diseases present in Brazos County. There were 14 cases of each reported.

Shaeffer kicked the extra point and the score was 13-26.

Pearson returned Dick Scott's 51 yard kick off for 26 yards. Eight plays later Bobby Goad scored with a pass from Royal. The conversion was successful from the twenty yard line.

Smith received the kickoff and returned the ball to the 26 yard line, but A&M's attack bogged down and Lary kicked off for 20 yards.

After seven plays, Lang, Sooner fullback, fumbled on a hand-off from Arnold, and Greiner made his second recovery of the game.

**Lippman Hurt**  
Smith failed to pierce the Sooner line, and Lippman tried a plunge over tackle only to be smothered at the line of scrimmage. Lary went in for Lippman, who had twisted his ankle, and punted for thirty yards.

Oklahoma took over on the Aggie 40, and in two plays Arnold had gained 12 yards on a run and a pass. In the closing seconds of the game, Arnold completed only one pass out of three with Bill Tidwell and Hill breaking up the other two passes.

The final flurry of passes was terminated by a penalty against the Sooners and time ran out and the gun sounded before the Oklahoma could run off another play.
