

W. C. Sherman, manager, bioogical research laboratory, Ralston Purina Co., St. Louis, received his Ph. D. degree from Wisconsin. From 1935 to 1941 he was with the nutrition department of Auburn and spent five years in the army as nutrition officer. He is noted for his work on tissue respiration.
