Entomologists Hear Sidal Speak

Cameron Sidal, entomologist of Cotton Poisons, Inc., presented a discussion of the needs for entomologists in commercial, extension, and industrial fields to the Entomology Society Tuesday evening, Nov. 8, in Science Hall, F. L. Rider, reporter said.

Sidal, class of '31, president of the Texas Entomological Society, the past several years he has been district manager for Cotton Poisons, Inc., a subsidiary of Pennsylvania Salt Co., and thereby has viewed the duties of entomologists in agriculture and industry.

Sidal presented the parallelism of entomological work between commercial, extension service, and industrial fields. Each field is similar in the respect that specific insecticides must be recommended for use in order to control certain insects Sidal said. There is no supposition or unnecessary claim for an insecticide which has not been proved of value by research and experimentation according to Sidal.

T. J. Muldowney selected a staff to assist him with the student publication "The Texas Aggie Entomologist." Louis G. Gray and Dick Griffith will serve as associate editors and Bob L. Blazek will be the business manager of the publication which is due this spring.

Waxahachie To Grant Negroes Equal Courses

Dallas, Nov. 18 (AP)—The Waxahachie school system has 30 days to provide equal opportunity for Negro students to study courses now offered white students there.

Federal Judge William H. Atwell made the decision Wednesday. He extended and clarified an order he handed down after a preliminary hearing Oct. 1. The judge told school officials to set up even courses that Negro students had not asked for.

The Negro parents who brought suit against the two school districts had asked the judge for a permanent injunction against "separate and unequal" schools.

They charged that both the courses of study and the physical plants at the school for Negroes were unequal to those offered white students in the same districts, in violation of the Constitution's 14th amendment.

The Negroes did not argue in either case for an order abolishing segregation. The original petitions had asked for an order declaring unconstitutional the board's policy of "providing facilities for Negro students because of their race and color."
