

Schoolboy Playoffs In Quarter-finals In AA and A Classes

Texas schoolboy football reaches the championship round in one division play-off this week and two other classes move into the quarter-finals.

One mighty upset was recorded last week, undefeated, untied Lubbock falling before Austin of El Paso, 12 to 37, in a Class AA bi-district game.

Sunset of Dallas and Thomas Jefferson of San Antonio meet Saturday at 2:30 p. m. at Dallas for the City Conference championship.

Sunset Friday night squeezed past Paschal of Fort Worth, 26 to 25, and Thomas Jefferson Saturday nosed out San Jacinto of Houston, 7 to 6.

Port Arthur, Marshall, Austin, Alice, Wichita Falls, Austin of El Paso, Highland Park and Abilene advanced to the Class AA quarter-finals.

Littlefield, Ballinger, Garland, Mineola, Mexia, New Braunfels, Uvalde and El Campo are in the quarter-finals of the Class A state championship chase.

Two Undefeated
Port Arthur, one of two remaining undefeated, untied teams in Class AA, meets Marshall Friday night at Port Arthur. The other

perfect club in this division, Wichita Falls, takes on Austin of El Paso at a site yet to be determined. Austin and Alice decided that they would play at Alice next Saturday at 2 p. m.

Littlefield squares off against Ballinger at Odessa Friday and Garland and Mineola tangle at Greenville Friday. No game sites have been picked for Mexia and New Braunfels and Uvalde and El Campo.

Austin of El Paso rammed over three touchdowns in the final quarter to rout Lubbock, the team that had been figured as one of two finalists in the Class AA race. Two of the touchdowns came on pass interceptions, both by George Clark on runs of 45 and 46 yards.

Port Arthur, doped as the probable state champion, came from behind to roll over Galveston. Don Rayburn's extra point after S. M. Meek's first perior 45-yard scoring run sent Thomas Jefferson into the finals of the City Conference. Carl Johnson scored for San Jacinto on a 16-yard run in the second period.

Ballinger racked up 27 points in a wild second half to come from behind and wallop Wink.

Browns, 49ers For AAC Title

The champion Cleveland Browns and San Francisco 49ers advanced Sunday to the final playoff for the All-America Football Conference title.

On a muddy, slippery field and before 17,270 fans, the Browns captured a see-saw game from the Buffalo Bills, 31 to 21.

In the other semifinal playoff clash at San Francisco, where a crowd of 41,393 looked on, the 49ers eliminated the New York Yankees, 17 to 7.

The championship game will be played in Cleveland next Sunday with the Browns seeking their fourth straight AAC title.

The Chicago Bears staged off a last half rally Sunday by Pittsburgh Steelers to win 30 to 21, and stay in the running for the

Western Division title of the National Football League.

Los Angeles' Rams still lead the Western division with a record of seven victories, two losses and two ties. The Bears have an 8-3 record.

A Bear victory and a Ram loss would give the Division title to Chicago. The Bears play the Cards and the Rams are host to Washington Sunday.

The Western Division winner will meet the Eastern Division champion, Philadelphia, for the NFL title Dec. 18.

Ags Meet St. Louis University Bilikens In St. Louis Tonight

In their first two games of the season, both against top-flight eastern competition, the Aggies lost to Long Island University's Blackbirds 52-66 and to Niagara University Saturday night, 50-53.

Tonight's game is the first of the season for the Bilikens, who in the past have been one of the top cage powers in the Midwest. Last year Coach Eddie Hickey's cagers boasted one of the top hardwood men in the nation in "Easy Ed" McCauley.

Last season was the last year of competition in college ranks for McCauley and with his departure went a lot of the Bilikens' strength.

With two games under their belts, Coach Marty Karow's cagers stand a good chance to make tonight's game their initial victory of the season.
