Baldwin was standing in the corner of the end zone to score. The charity benefit game was arranged by multi-millionaire oilman Glenn McCarthy. Proceeds from the \$15 tickets will be divided between the Damon Runyon Cancer Fund, Houston's new Holly Home for the Aged and the National Kids' Foundation.

Pre-game hi-jinx, a full hour of it, was provided by Hollywood talent, which McCarthy brought to Houston especially for the sports show. On hand were Jack Benny, Phil Harris, Dinar Shore and columnist Jimmie Fidler.

Background music was by Freddy Martin and his band, currently playing an engagement at McCarthy's plush Shamrock Hotel. McCarthy said 20,000 tickets were sold to the game, which would have two-thirds filled Rice Stadium.
