**Old 'Mo' Off Sand Bank; May Join Mothball Fleet**

Norfolk, Va., Feb. 2.—(AP)—The Battleship Missouri slid off a sand bank yesterday with a sigh heard at naval stations the world over. Release from 15-day captivity on Thimble Shoal came quietly, almost before men closest to the scene knew it. But the word spread rapidly as the "Mighty Mo" edged into deep water.

The great battleship, historic scene of Japan's surrender, headed immediately for the navy yard and dry docking.

Although plans were still to have the Missouri go to the Caribbean for a big training operation later in the month, a discordant note came from Washington.

There Rep. Vinson (D-Ga.), chairman of the House Armed Service Committee, proposed that the Missouri be put in mothballs along with all other battleships and be replaced in the active fleet with an aircraft carrier.
