**Ex-War Prisoners Will Get Benefits**

Washington, Feb. 8—(AP)—All Americans who were prisoners of war in Germany and Japan will get \$1 for every day they spent in prison, under a ruling by the War Claims Commission today.

The ruling stated that all prisoners of war camps in Germany and Japan were sub-standard. The War Claims Act provides for the \$1-a-day payment for days a POW did not get food of the "quality and quantity" established by the Geneva Convention of 1929.

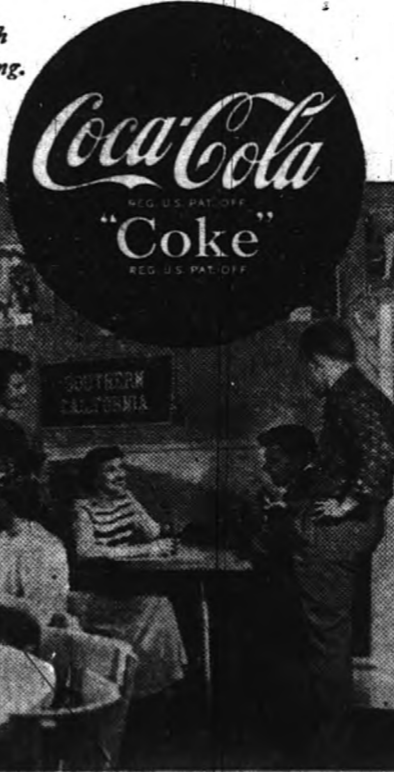
