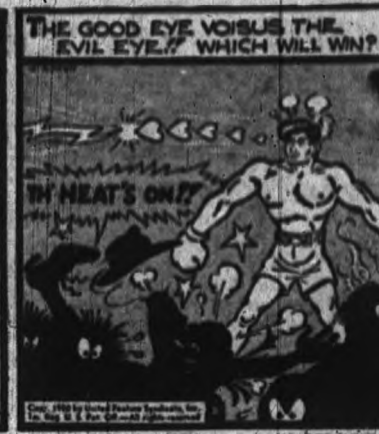
Walton Available For Soph Dates
