W. A. Hamilton, '40, will address the student chapter of the American Society of Civil Engineers tonight at 7:30 in the CE Lecture Room, Willy Bobbman, president of the society, said this morning.

Hamilton is assistant engineer in the office of the chief engineer of the Santa Fe Railroad. A graduate of A&M, he majored in high structural engineering and minored in structural engineering.

During the war, Hamilton was kept as a Japanese prisoner after he was captured on Corregidor. A prisoner ship on which he was being transported was torpedoed in August, 1945.

While at A&M, Hamilton was a first lieutenant in E Battery, Field Artillery.

His present work with the Santa Fe Railroad is in the bridge design department.

4-H Club Men Win Awards

Seven outstanding 4-H cotton producers in Texas have been selected to receive the 1949 Anderson-Clayton Scholarship Award, Floyd Lynch, state 4-H leader of A&M, announced today.

Each winner will be awarded a \$200 college scholarship to be used for studying agriculture at any one of six Texas Colleges, A&M included.

Selection of the winners was made by a committee composed of Extension Service personnel at A&M. Acting on this committee were Fred Elliot, E. A. Miller, and C. H. Bates.

Selection was based on club members record of achievement in producing at least one bale of cotton, participation by the member in club and community activities, scholarship, leadership, and a story written by that member on "Contributions made by the member in the 4-H Cotton Program".

Winners of the contest are Bobby Fitzgerald, Wilbarger County; John L. Byars, Hall County; Robert Greger, Falls County; Jimmy Rothwell, Lamar County; Raymond Kallas, Wharton County; Weldon Driebrodt, Guadalupe County; and Dewayne Peterson, Martin County.

Bradley 'Double' Possibility The District Five participant won't be decided until Monday, March 20, a week hence, when Bradley, Missouri Valley Conference tlist, clashes with the winner of the Big Seven Conference.

Bradley thus is the only team so far that has an opportunity to become the first team in history to win the NIT and NCAA tournaments in one season. At the moment Nebraska is leading the Big Seven by a half game over Kansas and Kansas State. The Cornhuskers were upset, 64-48, by Oklahoma Saturday night.

A playoff also will determine the District Six representative. The playoff probably will involve Arkansas and Baylor, co-champions of the Southwest Conference, Houston of the Gulf and Arizona of the border. Arizona, however, may be dropped as it lost two games during the past week.

Brigham Young Challenges District Seven is between Brigham Young and Denver who are deadlocked for the lead in the Skyline Big Six. Denver split with Utah State over the weekend while Brigham Young downed Wyoming, erstwhile leaders, twice to pull into a tie for the top rung. The co-leaders clash at Brigham Young Monday night to decide the issue.

The District Eight nod will go to the winner of the Pacific Coast Conference championship which will be contested by UCLA, Southern Division champs and Washington State, Northern Division winners.

The dates for the National Invitation are March 11, 13, 14, 16 and 18.

The dates for the NCAA are, East, at New York, March 23-25, and West, at Kansas City, March 24-25, with the championship game scheduled for Madison Square Garden on March 28.
