**Soil Scientist Will Address Grad School**

Dr. Richard Bradfield, head of the Department of Agronomy at Cornell University, will speak on "The World's People Can Be Fed." in the Physics Lecture Room at 8 p. m., Friday. The talk will be the fifth in the 1949-50 Graduate Lecture Series sponsored by the Graduate School.

Dr. Bradfield is a well known soil scientist with primary interest in soil fertility, structure and colloids, and physical chemistry of soils. Dr. I. P. Trotter, dean of Graduate School, said.

He has received international recognition in his field, having been a Guggenheim Memorial Foundation fellow at the Kaiser Wilhelm Institute in Berlin in 1927-28.

In 1935 he was sent as a delegate of the United States to the International Congress of Soil Scientists in Oxford, England, and he has served on many other national and international committees and commissions. He is consultant to the Rockefeller Foundation for their program in Mexico, Trotter added.

Dr. Bradfield is a soil scientist for the Bureau of Plant Industry of the United States Department of Agriculture. He is also a member of the American Chemical Society and the International Society of Soil Scientists, and has served as president of the American Society of Agronomy in 1941 and the Soil Science Society of America in 1936.

**Debate Tourney Is Planned This Week**

The A&M invitational debate tournament to be held here Friday and Saturday is expected to draw approximately 70 visitors to the campus, Joe Fuller, president of the Discussion and Debate Society, said this morning.

Schools definitely entered in the tournament are Baylor, TCU, Rice, SMU, Del Mar Jr. College, University of Corpus Christi, Midwestern University, Wharton Jr. College, University of Houston, and A&M.

The debate question will be "whether or not the United States should nationalize the basic non-agricultural industries."

Several girl teams are entered in the debate tournament.

**Sewer Project For Area Nears**

Negotiations for a joint sewage project between College Station and Bryan were virtually completed Friday night when the Bryan city council voted their approval of the agreement in a called session. The College Station council has yet to vote on the issue, but it is expected to pass easily, according to J. A. Orr, city councilman.

College Station will build and maintain the part of the line beginning at Highland Park addition near the railroad and running east to Howell Boulevard.

Bryan's part of the 3,179 foot eight and ten-inch line begins at Howell Boulevard and runs across A&M property into North Oakwood addition about a block from Highway 6. The line then parallels Inwood Drive through Garden Acres addition to the main cut-fall sewage line, about three-quarters of a mile north of the treatment plant.

College Station will pay Bryan about \$4,500 per year per connection for the actual cost of treating the sewage, Orr said. Initial connections on the College Station section of the line will probably number 20 to 25.

The recommendation for agreement on the constructed line was made by a joint committee composed of College Station Councilman, J. A. Orr, City Engineer, Fred J. Benson, and Bryan City Engineer J. M. Orman.
