### Consolidated Staff Named for 1950-51

All teachers in the A&M Consolidated school system were re-elected by the school board at its regular meeting Monday night. The principals of the four public schools also were re-elected for the 1950-51 school year and Supt. Las Richardson was re-elected for a three-year term.

The board also commended all members of the system for a good year. No resignations are anticipated for the next year, Sept. Richardson said yesterday. Two new teachers have been added to the A&M Consolidated Junior High School faculty recently. Mrs. Annie Barnes replaces Mrs. Gloria Neeley Stroud as junior high mathematics teacher upon Mrs. Stroud's move to Houston. Mrs. Barnes has a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in mathematics from the University of Texas. Mrs. Dorothy Rush replaces Mrs. Florence Mohr as junior high English teacher. Mrs. Rush, a graduate of Baylor University, taught two years in Liberty, Texas and five years in Waco.

The board made the appointments formal for the remainder of the 1949-50 school year. Carl Furillo of the Brooklyn Dodgers batted .431 during the period from Aug. 8 to the end of the 1949 season.
