

# Officials of City Government Will Be Elected Tomorrow

The citizens of College Station will choose five men from a field of nine to conduct the city government for 1950-51, in an election of city officers to be held tomorrow, April 4, at the City Hall.

Professor A. Mitchell will be the presiding judge over the election.

The offices of mayor, corporation court recorder, and Ward I councilman have only one candidate each, while Ward II shows an abundance of candidates with four men having filed. There were two

applicants for councilman of Ward III.

**Three Positions Unopposed**  
Ernest Langford, veteran mayor of College Station, will be unopposed in the election as will C. J. Gorzycki, who has filed for re-election to the position of corporation court recorder. J. A. Orr, present councilman of Ward I, is also unopposed.

Candidates filing for councilman of Ward II are E. E. Ames, incumbent councilman of the ward, and W. H. Freiburger, College Station barber.

The highly contested Ward II position on the council is sought

by H. E. Halpin, present councilman and professor in the Agricultural Economics and Sociology Department; Billie Mitchell, College Station insurance man; L. S. Berryman, of the A&M M. E. Department; and Jack Keese of the C. E. Department of A&M.

Those people who have paid their poll tax or have their exemptions and live within the respective wards are qualified voters.

**Wards Outlined**  
Parts of College Station included in Ward I are Oakwood Addition, College Park, West Park, Breeze Heights, Holick Addition, and the part of Southwest College Park that is within the city limits.

Ward II includes the area south of Sulphur Springs road and west of Highway 6, taking in all of College Hills.  
The part of the city north of Sulphur Springs road, including the North Gate area and all of the campus, composes Ward III.

# Gilchrist, Cadets Open Cancer Drive

Gibb Gilchrist, chancellor of the A&M System and State Cancer Crusade chairman, will officially open the 1950 "Cancer Crusade Month" in Austin tonight in a network broadcast which will include a musical program featuring the Singing Cadets.

The campaign officially opened in Brazos County Saturday, with Claude A. Edge of Bryan Crusade chairman. Mrs. J. M. Jones is in charge of women's activities. Dr. Richard Grant Jr. is chairman of the county unit and Dr. Henry Harrison is vice-chairman.

**Proclamation Issued**

Ernest Langford, mayor of College Station, issued an official proclamation this morning proclaiming April as Cancer Control

Month in the city. The proclamation reads as follows:

"Whereas, the disease, cancer, represents a community health problem in College Station, as well as throughout the nation. Whereas, measures must be taken to combat the present cancer death rate easing the tragedy for individuals and lightening the community burden of the great social and economic losses resulting from cancer.

Whereas, cancer control, to be effective, must be the vital concern of each and every one of us, therefore, I, Ernest Langford, mayor of the City of College Station, hereby proclaim APRIL as CANCER CONTROL MONTH and request that the citizens of

this city observe it as such.

I urge all residents of College Station for the protection of themselves and their loved ones to learn the essential facts about this disease, I further request that all individuals, institutions, business, and organizations support, cooperate with and assist the County Unit of the American Cancer Society in the 1950 Cancer Crusade."

**Mail Solicitations**

County-wide mail solicitations for funds will be carried out by the local unit of the American Cancer Society. Pat Newton is county treasurer. Checks should be made payable to the American Cancer Society and sent to Newton at the First State Bank in Bryan.

Deaths from cancer in Texas reached a total of 7,271 during the past year, according to Dr. George W. Cox, state health officer. He said that a warning against cancer, "quacks" and so-called cancer cures—is justified by the State Health Department.

Cancer deaths in Brazos county last year totaled 2, according to Mrs. Jones.

Mrs. C. B. Campbell of the A&M Garden Club will be the guest speaker at the Tuesday morning meeting of the Bryan Garden Club.


