

# Bears Top Ags, 7-1, In Kyle Field Clash

Portside Fred Copeland pitched the Baylor Bears to a 7-1 baseball victory over A&M before 2,000 disappointed Aggie partisans at the Kyle Field diamond Friday.

After pitching six innings of the opener Thursday, the little left-hander assumed the duties of an iron man Friday, hurling four-hit ball and going the distance to knock A&M out of a mathematical chance of winning an undisputed conference title.

The Aggies can tie league-leading Texas (victor over Rice Saturday, 5-0) if they sweep the two-game series with the Longhorns in Austin Wednesday and Thursday and then win a postponed SMU contest.

Loose Cadet defensive play proved to be the cause of every Bear scoring thrust. Two of the three Bruins runs scored in the first were unearned.

Starter Sam Blanton, after allowing two hits in the initial frame, pitched no-hit ball until the eighth when Baylor gained its final four markers.

The four-run outburst in the eighth was highlighted by a 345-foot home run by catcher Hogo Pearson who drove two runs home ahead of him.

After the four-bagger Blanton issued successive singles to Roland Walters and Hubert Powell before he was relieved by George Brown.

Brown whiffed one Baylor batsman and forced another to ground

out to retire the side.

Shug McPherson collected the first Aggie hit from Copeland in the fifth. McPherson rapped out a Texas League single, advanced to third off an infield error and fielder's choice, and registered the only Cadet counter when Hank Candelari slapped a deep fly to center.

# Weaver of Rice Victor In SWC Golf; Tennis Divided

Austin, Tex., May 15—(AP)—Buddy Weaver of Rice shot a two-under par-69 for the last 18 holes Friday to win the Southwest Conference Golf Championship with a 72-hole score of 280.

Weaver had a 65 Friday morning to take the lead at 54 holes over Morris Williams Jr., of Texas, who shot a 69 to make his total 213—two strokes more than Weaver.

Williams turned in a 68 in the afternoon to lose by one stroke on his 72-hole total of 281.

Wesley Ellis of Texas wound up third with 285.

Austin, Texas, May 15—(AP)—Chick Harris and Jack Turpin of Rice Saturday won the Tennis doubles championship of the Southwest Conference, beating Julian Oates and James Saunders of Texas in the finals.

Harris and Turpin won, 6-4, 6-1, 6-2.

In the singles championship played off Saturday morning, Ken Crawford of Southern Methodist, the 1945 champion, beat Harris, the 1949 champion, 7-5, 6-3, 6-0, for this year's title.

Austin, Tex., May 15—(AP)—Lamar of Houston won the third

annual Interscholastic League City Conference track and field championship, was second with 54, followed by Brackenridge of San Antonio with 46.

Odessa nosed out Ball High of Galveston, 57-55, in Austin last Saturday to take the conference AA team championship in the 40th annual Texas Interscholastic League track meet.

# Texas Dethrones A&M In SWC Track Meet

Austin, Tex., May 15—(AP)—The University of Texas returned to glory in Southwest Conference track and field today, winning the championship by a margin of 17 points over A&M which had held the title for three straight years.

Five records fell before the onslaught of the finest field in the South with chunky Tom Cox of Rice and Flynn Charley Parker of Texas the standouts of a meet that did not go according to form.

It was supposed to be a gripping battle between A&M and Texas, but the latter jumped in front from the start with a record-breaking 440-yard relay and went on to produce two of the marks hung up.

Parker Wins Sprints

Parker, running his last time for Texas, won the 100-yard dash for the first time and also took the 220 for the fourth straight time, and topped off his performance with a great anchor lap on the record-running sprint relay team. He was high point man with 11 1/4.

Cox, the tremendous Rice quarter-miler, set a new record of 46.9. In this event and ran a 47.4 anchor on the mile relay team that set a new mark of 3:14.3.

Bob Walters of Texas vied for top honors by winning the high jump with a leap of 6 feet, 8 5/8 inches, which not only was a new conference record but was the highest anybody has jumped in the nation this year. Walters also tied for first in the pole vault.

Hampton Loses

A tragic figure of the meet was J. D. Hampton, the A&M distance star, who holds the conference records in the mile and two-mile. He was beaten in the mile by teammate Julian Herring by a yard and lost the two-mile by more than 100 yards to Jim Brown of Arkansas.

Kadera Takes Discus

George Kadera of A&M won the discus throw for the fourth straight year with a pitch of 162 feet 7 inches—7 1/4 inches away from the conference record.

Walters' jump was the best he ever did and bettered his leap of 6 feet 8 3/16 inches at the Kansas Relays last year. That also was the best jump in the nation for the year.

A&M Wins Five

The Aggies came through as expected in but five events. Besides Herring winning the mile, Bob Hall won his speciality, the low hurdles, in 23.3 with Cadet Billy Bless a close second.

Paul Leming ran a fine flight of high hurdles to win decisively in 14.5. George Kadera won his favorite event but was denied by 7" the conference record for which he has been shooting for four years. His toss was 162 7/8".

The last first for A&M came on sophomore Ivan Graves' 15' 6" jump in the pole vault tying with Bob Walters of Texas.

# League Race Nearing Finish as Texas Leads

Texas reached the dormie stage in the race last week by whipping Texas Christian 1-0, and Rice, 5-0, while Texas A&M was splitting with Baylor, winning the first game, 11-4, but dropping the second, 7-1.

Texas Christian beat Southern Methodist 3-0, in the other conference game of the week, Sam Houston topped Rice, 8-0, on a no-hitter in non-conference play.

Wednesday and Thursday Baylor and Southern Methodist play at Waco but the games mean nothing in the title race.
